World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler (T1/-11)

- Eighth career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (3-for-7 to date) and third this season (2-for-2)
- Ties Rickie Fowler and Rory McIlroy for the most 54-hole leads/co-leads on TOUR this season (3)
- Results with the 54-hole lead/co-lead: 3rd/2020 American Express, T2/2021 Texas Children's Houston Open, **Won/2022 Masters Tournament**, P2/2022 Charles Schwab Challenge, T2/2022 TOUR Championship, **Won/2023 WM Phoenix Open**, **Won/2023 PLAYERS Championship**
- Would move to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings with a win; no player has entered the TOUR Championship with the lead in the FedExCup two years in a row (Scheffler entered No. 1 in 2022)
- Official Money total of \$19,254,342 is the highest in a single season in PGA TOUR history

Matt Fitzpatrick (T1/-11)

- Fourth career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (2-for-3 to date) and second this season (1-for-1)
- Results with the 54-hole lead/co-lead: 2nd/2019 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, **Won/2022 U.S. Open**, **Won/2023 RBC Heritage**
- 54-hole total of 199 ties his career-low on TOUR (2023 RBC Heritage/Won)
- Entered the week No. 40 in the FedExCup standings and is projected to move to No. 5 (could move as high as No. 3 with a win); made the TOUR Championship for the first time in 2022 (finished 15th in the FedExCup standings)
- Best finish in two prior starts at the BMW Championship: T6, 2020 (at Olympia Fields Country Club)

Third-Round Lead Notes

- 13 54-hole leaders/co-leaders to win the BMW Championship since 2000 (most recent: Patrick Cantlay/2022)
- 25 54-hole leaders/co-leaders to win individual stroke-play events on TOUR in 2022-23 (including each of the last five weeks)

Miscellaneous Notes

- The top three players on the leaderboard have all won a major in the last two seasons: Scheffler (2022 Masters Tournament), Fitzpatrick (2022 U.S. Open) and **Brian Harman** (2023 Open Championship)
- **Sam Burns**, who entered the week No. 30 in the FedExCup standings, ties his career-low score (62) and moves from T33 to T7 on the leaderboard (second 62 and first since the second round of the 2021 AT&T Byron Nelson)
- The six automatic qualifiers for the U.S. Ryder Cup Team are currently projected to be Scottie Scheffler, Wyndham Clark, Brian Harman, Patrick Cantlay, Max Homa and Xander Schauffele; Brooks Koepka is projected to fall from No. 5 to No. 7 in the standings

FedExCup Playoffs notes

- The top-30 players in the FedExCup standings after BMW Championship will advance to the TOUR Championship
- Three players are projected to move into the top 30: **Matt Fitzpatrick** (T1, No. 40 to No. 5), **Justin Rose** (T7, No. 32 to No. 26) and **Denny McCarthy** (T7, No. 34 to No. 30)
- Three players are projected to move out of the top 30: **Jordan Spieth** (T30, No. 27 to No. 31), **Emiliano Grillo** (T38, No. 23 to No. 32) and **Sepp Straka** (T43, No. 24 to No. 33)
