Viktor Hovland (Won/-17)

- Picks up his fifth PGA TOUR victory in his 97th start at the age of 25 years, 11 months, 2 days
- PGA TOUR wins (5): 2020 Puerto Rico Open, 2020 World Wide Technology Championship, 2021 World Wide Technology Championship, 2023 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, 2023 BMW Championship
- Becomes the ninth multiple winner of the season; wins multiple times for the first time in a season on TOUR
- Sets the Olympia Fields Country Club course record with a 9-under 61 (his career-low round on TOUR); includes 10 birdies, most of his PGA TOUR career
- Posts the lowest final round score in BMW Championship and FedExCup Playoffs history
- Records the lowest finish by a winner on TOUR since Tom Kim won the 2022 Wyndham Championship with a 61
- Personal-best nine-hole score of 28 on the back nine, equaling best nine-hole score on TOUR this season (seventh instance)
- Moves from No. 7 to No. 2 in the FedExCup standings; has advanced to the TOUR Championship all four seasons as a PGA TOUR member (best finish was fifth in 2021)
- Wins in his fourth BMW Championship start (T40/2020, T17/2021, T35/2022, Won/2023)
- Led the field in Driving Accuracy (43 of 56)
- Remains No. 5 in the Official World Golf Rankings

World No. 1 and FedExCup leader Scottie Scheffler (T2/-15)

- Finishes runner-up for the seventh time in 110 PGA TOUR starts
- Moves from No. 2 to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings, becoming the first player to enter the TOUR Championship with the lead in the FedExCup two years in a row (finished the season No. 2 in the FedExCup in 2022)
- In the last two seasons, has six wins (most on TOUR) and six runner-up finishes (tied with Cameron Young for most on TOUR)
- Official Money total of \$21,014,342 is the highest in a single season in PGA TOUR history
- Falls to 3-for-8 when holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead and 2-for-3 this season

Miscellaneous Notes

- The six automatic qualifiers for the U.S. Ryder Cup Team are Scottie Scheffler, Wyndham Clark, Brian Harman, Patrick Cantlay, Max Homa and Xander Schauffele
- **Matt Fitzpatrick** (T2) falls to 2-for-4 to date when holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead: 2nd/2019 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, Won/2022 U.S. Open, Won/2023 RBC Heritage, T2/2023 BMW Championship; finishes runner-up for the third time in 133 TOUR starts
- 2021 and 2022 BMW Championship winner **Patrick Cantlay** finishes T15; the last player to win the same event three straight years is Steve Stricker at the John Deere Classic (2009, 2010, 2011)
- **Lucas Glover** finishes T22 in bid to become the first player to win three consecutive weeks on TOUR since Tiger Woods in 2006 (PGA Championship, WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, Deutsche Bank Championship)

FedExCup Playoffs notes

- The top-30 players in the FedExCup standings after the BMW Championship advance to the TOUR Championship

- One player moved into the top 30: **Matt Fitzpatrick** (T2, No. 40 to No. 10)
- One player fell out of the top 30: **Chris Kirk** (T29, No. 29 to No. 32)
- Five players will make their debut at the TOUR Championship next week: Wyndham Clark (9th), Tom Kim (16th), Taylor Moore (21st), Nick Taylor (22nd), Adam Schenk (23rd)
