**TOP STORYLINES**

**FedExCup Fall:** The 2023 Butterfield Bermuda Championship is the sixth event of the FedExCup Fall, a group of seven tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2024 PGA TOUR Season. Nos. 1-50 in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions while Nos. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points over. Nos. 51-60 through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2024: AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational. The Top 125 will be exempt into all Full-Field events and THE PLAYERS Championship next season and Nos. 126-150 will earn conditional status on TOUR next season.

Winners of events during the FedExCup Fall receive the same benefits of winners of Full-Field Events during the Regular Season, including 500 FedExCup points, Official World Golf Ranking points, a two-year PGA TOUR exemption (exempt thru 2025) and invitations to The Sentry, THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament and PGA Championship.

This is the fifth time the Butterfield Bermuda Championship has been played and fourth time it serves as a standalone event with the winner receiving the full 500 FedExCup points. In the event's first year, during the 2019-20 season, the tournament was played as an Additional Event the same week as the WGC-HSBC Champions.

This is the PGA TOUR's third consecutive event played outside the United States, following the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP in Japan and the World Wide Technology Championship in Mexico. 14 players in the field will have competed in all three tournaments: Tyson Alexander, Akshay Bhatia, Thomas Detry, Ben Griffin, Harry Hall, Nick Hardy, Mark Hubbard, Satoshi Kodaira, David Lingmerth, David Lipsky, Justin Lower, Davis Riley, Brandon Wu and Kevin Yu.

Four players have made the cut in all four editions of the Butterfield Bermuda Championship (bold in field): 2020 champion **Brian Gay**, **Russell Knox**, Denny McCarthy and 2022 champion Seamus Power. Gay has finished T12 or better in each year at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship and has not finished T12 or better at any other PGA TOUR event in that span (last such result at any other PGA TOUR event: T7, 2019 Shriners Children's Open).

**Two players in the field qualified for the BMW Championship and are exempt for all Signature Events in 2024:** Lucas Glover, who made it to the TOUR Championship and finished No. 18 in the FedExCup standings, and 2019 Butterfield Bermuda Championship winner Brendon Todd, who finished No. 47 in the standings.

**Seven other players in the field qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs:** Thomas Detry, Ben Griffin, Nick Hardy, Mark Hubbard, Davis Riley, Alex Smalley and Brandon Wu.

**Six players in the field have won a tournament this season:** Akshay Bhatia (Barracuda Championship), Nico Echavarria (Puerto Rico Open), Lucas Glover (Wyndham Championship, FedEx St. Jude Championship), Nick Hardy (Zurich Classic of New Orleans), Luke List (2023 Sanderson Farms Championship) and Davis Riley (Zurich Classic of New Orleans).

\*McNealy returned from a left shoulder injury at last week's World Wide Technology Championship (MC), his first start on TOUR since the RBC Canadian Open. He may be entitled to a medical extension.

**PGA TOUR debut at 15:** 15-year-old Oliver Betschart earned a sponsor exemption through the local qualifier and will make his PGA TOUR debut. At age 15 years, 3 months, 8 days on Thursday, Betschart will become the fifth-youngest player to make his PGA TOUR debut on record. Betschart is the second 15-year-old to compete at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship, joining fellow Bermuda native Kenny Leseur, who missed the cut in 2019 (15 years, 9 months, 22 days on the day of the first round). This is the second consecutive week that a player younger than 18 has competed on TOUR. 17-year-old Billy Davis got into the World Wide Technology Championship via the Open Qualifier and missed the cut.
