Things to Know

- Tony Finau matches career-low score on the PGA TOUR of 62 to lead by four strokes, the largest 36-hole lead on TOUR since J.T. Poston led by the same amount en route to winning the 2022 John Deere Classic
- Seeking a fifth consecutive top-30 finish this season, Patrick Rodgers includes six birdies and an eagle to post a 7-under 63, two strokes shy of his career-low score on TOUR
- When round two resumed Saturday morning, Alex Noren finished his last three holes birdie-par-par to sign for a 4-under 66 and move to T2
- University of Texas senior and this week's lone amateur, Travis Vick, makes the cut, sits T25 at 3-under 137

- Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win the Cadence Bank Houston Open since 2000 (most recent: Paul Casey/2009)
- 3 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to convert for the win in the 2022-23 PGA TOUR Season (most recent: Russell Henley/World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba)

- After making birdie on three of his last five holes in round one (-5/65), birdied seven of his first 10 holes in round two en route to a career-low-tying 8-under 62; his final of 10 total birdies in round two came at his last three holes, Nos. 16-18
- Four strokes is the largest 36-hole lead on TOUR since J.T. Poston led by the same amount en route to winning the 2022 John Deere Classic in July
- Through 36 holes, is -10 on the front nine and -3 on the back nine
- Made 156' 3" total putts in round one and 79' 6" in round two

- Best finish in six previous Cadence Bank Houston Open starts were a pair of T24s; 2018 (Golf Club of Houston) and 2020 (Memorial Park Golf Course)
- Is 0-for-3 when holding at least a share of the 36-hole lead on the PGA TOUR
- In only previous start this season, missed last week's cut at World Wide Technology Championship at Mayaokba
- Seeks fifth PGA TOUR victory in his 218th start; claimed his maiden TOUR title at the 2016 Puerto Rico Open; five years, four months, 26 days elapsed before earning second TOUR title at 2021 FedEx St. Jude Championship; claimed win Nos. 3 and 4 in consecutive weeks this past July at the 3M Open and Rocket Mortgage Classic.

Additional Player Notes

- Highlighted by an eagle (par-5 third hole) and six birdies, Patrick Rodgers (T2/-9) improved upon an opening-round 2-under 68 in round one with a 7-under 63 in Friday's second round; in four previous starts at the Cadence Bank Houston Open, has three missed cuts and a T51 (2019); in his most recent three PGA TOUR starts this season, finished T16/ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, T3/Butterfield Bermuda Championship and T27/World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba
- In search of his first career TOUR title in his 139th start, Sweden's **Alex Noren** (T2/-9) opened his second Cadence Bank Houston Open (MC/2020) in 65-66; most recent of two runner-up finishes came earlier this year at the Barracuda Championship
- Tyson Alexander (4th/-8) starts his eighth career PGA TOUR event with back-to-back 4-under 66s; best of previous seven starts: T44/Butterfield Bermuda Championship; earned his first PGA TOUR card via the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Regular Season and became the first player in Korn Ferry Tour history to successfully defend a title, winning the 2021 and 2022 Veritex Bank Championship at Texas Rangers Golf Club in Arlington, Texas
- World No. 2 and Dallas resident, **Scottie Scheffler**, enters round three T20 at 4-under 136; needs a win this week to reclaim the No. 1 spot in the OWGR
- University of Texas senior and only amateur in this week's field, Travis Vick, made the cut at 3-under 137 (T25); in two previous PGA TOUR starts, missed the cut at the 2022 U.S. Open and at last week's World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba
- Danny Willett, Jim Herman, Sam Burns, Anders Albertson, Austin Smotherman and Erik van Rooyen withdrew during round two
