Today – A complex of showers and thunderstorms 100 miles to the northwest of Colonial Country Club is forecast to continue to decay and will likely dissipate over the next 2-3 hours, leaving a mix of sun and clouds and dry conditions for the morning hours. An isolated (10-20%) coverage of pop-up showers and weak thunderstorms is expected this afternoon with a high temperature of 85°F. Winds will be east-southeasterly and will increase to 7-13 mph during the afternoon. **Sunrise: 6:25am / Sunset: 8:28pm**

Extended forecast – Isolated afternoon and early evening pop-up showers and weak thunderstorms will pose a low threat Friday through Sunday. The weather pattern will continue to promote afternoon and evening thunderstorms across the Panhandle and Big Bend Country regions of Texas through the weekend, with this activity likely to grow upscale into thunderstorm complexes during the evening hours each day. This organized activity will then drift off to the south-southeast during the overnight and early morning hours but is forecast to remain well to the west of Colonial Country Club Friday through Sunday.
