Second-Round Notes - Friday, March 24, 2023

Weather: Mostly sunny. High of 84. Wind ENE 15-20 mph, gusting to 26 mph.

Cut: 72 players at even-par 144 from a field of 118 professionals and two amateurs.

### Things to Know

- In Corales Puntacana Championship debut, Matt Wallace holds 36-hole lead/co-lead for second time on PGA TOUR
- PGA TOUR rookie Sam Stevens and Wyndham Clark sit one back at the midway point
- Special Temporary Member Akshay Bhatia ties the 18-hole tournament scoring record with a second-round 9-under 63
- 2018 Corales Puntacana Championship winner Brice Garnett and Tyler Duncan are the only players among those at 8-under or better on the leaderboard with a TOUR victory
- Garnett and Jonathan Byrd are the only players to make the cut in all six editions of the event
- Defending champion Chad Ramey withdrew prior to the start of his second round due to back injury

# Matt Wallace (1st/-11)

- At 11-under 133, tops his best opening 36-hole score on TOUR by one stroke (134/2021 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP)
- Holds the second-round lead/co-lead for the second time on TOUR (2021 Wells Fargo Championship/T6)
- Seeks first career PGA TOUR title in his 80th start
- Would become the fifth first-time winner on TOUR this season and fourth in tournament history (Brice Garnett/2018, Joel Dahmen/2021, Chad Ramey/2022)
- Four of the five champions of the Corales Puntacana Championship were in their 30s when they won (Chad Ramey was 29)

- Has a pair of top-three finishes on TOUR: T3/2019 PGA Championship, 3rd/2021 Valero Texas Open
- Lone top-10 finish in 11 starts this season: T7 at last week's Valspar Championship
- Owns four DP World Tour titles, three of them coming in 2018

## Sam Stevens (T2/-10)

- Matches career-low round on TOUR with a 7-under 65 (Puerto Rico Open/R3)
- Best position after any round on TOUR prior to this week: T3/R3/2023 Puerto Rico Open (T15)
- PGA TOUR rookie is making his tournament debut
- Seeks his first career PGA TOUR title in his 16th start (best: T13/2023 Farmers Insurance Open)
- Would become the second rookie to win on TOUR this season (Nico Echavarria/Puerto Rico Open)

## Wyndham Clark (T2/-10)

- Making second tournament start after finishing T22 in 2022 with scores of 70-68-70-71
- Made eagle at No. 4 in round one and two
- Best career finish on TOUR in 129 starts: P2/2020 Bermuda Championship (lost in playoff to Brian Gay)
- Three top-10s this season: T10/The RSM Classic, T10/WM Phoenix Open, 5th/Valspar Championship

## Akshay Bhatia (T4/-8)

- Matches career low on TOUR (63/R2/2022 RSM Classic) and ties the 18-hole tournament scoring record with a 9-under 63 (Brice Garnett/R1/2018, Chip McDaniel/R4/2019)
- Records career-high birdies in a round with nine (previous: 8/2023 Puerto Rico Open/R4)
- Making second start at the Corales Puntacana Championship (MC/2020)
- Making second start since joining the TOUR as a Special Temporary Member (MC/2023 Valspar Championship) after runner-up finish at 2023 Puerto Rico Open
- Has unlimited sponsor exemptions for the remainder of the season as he seeks his PGA TOUR card for the 2024 season

## **Miscellaneous Notes**

• **Tyler Duncan** (T4/-8) posts six birdies in a row (Nos. 4 -9) in the second round, matching the tournament record for most consecutive birdies

- 2018 Corales Puntacana Championship winner **Brice Garnett** (T4/-8) follows first-round co-lead with 2-under 70; with his win in 2018, set tournament records for low 18-hole score (63) and low winning total (270), which have since been matched; also owns largest margin of victory (4 strokes) and remains the only wire-to-wire winner of this event
- Two players have made the cut in all six editions of the Corales Puntacana Championship

- Thomas Detry (T10/-6), the highest-ranked player in the field at No. 82 in the Official World Golf Ranking, extends his streak of par-or-batter rounds at this event to 18; making fifth-consecutive tournament start (T33/2019, T33/2020, T13/2021, T15/2022)
- First-round co-leader **Ben Martin** (T10/-6) finished runner-up at this event last year after holding the 18-, 36- and 54-hole leads/co-leads; has one top-10 finish in 14 starts on TOUR this season (T5/The Honda Classic)
- MJ Daffue (T19/-5) aced the par-3 17th using a 6-iron from 172 yards to record his second hole-in-one on TOUR (2022 Sanderson Farms Championship/R1); becomes the third player with two aces this season (Wyndham Clark, Ryan Armour); marks the sixth hole-in-one in tournament history and first since Stephan Jaeger in 2021 (No. 2, R1)
- Defending champion Chad Ramey withdrew prior to the start of his second round due to back injury
