Things to Know

- Denmark's Nicolai Højgaard seeks a victory to become eligible for PGA TOUR membership
- Sam Stevens attempts to become the second PGA TOUR rookie to win on TOUR this season
- Højgaard and Stevens have 22 total PGA TOUR starts between them
- Thomas Detry has 19 scores of par-or-better in 19 rounds at this event
- Any player at 13-under or better, except Tyler Duncan, would become the fifth first-time winner on TOUR this season and fourth in tournament history (Brice Garnett/2018, Joel Dahmen/2021, Chad Ramey/2022)
- 54-hole leader/co-leader has won three of five times at the Corales Puntacana Championship

Nicolai Højgaard (T1/-14)

- Dane, who turned 22 on March 12, enters final round with a 39-hole bogey-free streak (bogey/No. 15/R1)
- Holds his first lead/co-lead after any round on the PGA TOUR; best position prior to this week: T7/2022 Genesis Scottish
 Open/MC
- Leads the field in birdies this week (19), greens in regulation (44 of 54) and driving distance (332.5 yards); also owns longest drive of the week (402 yards/No. 12/R2)
- Marks just the second time in eight starts on TOUR that he has made the cut (T53/2022 Open Championship)
- Makes second appearance at Corales Puntacana Championship (MC/73-71/2022)

- Successful amateur career included wins at the 2018 European Amateur and joining his twin brother, Rasmus, as part of the winning Danish team at the 2018 Eisenhower Trophy
- In 2021, he and his brother won in back-to-back weeks on the DP World Tour (Rasmus/Omega European Masters, Nicolai/DS Automobiles Italian Open), the first brothers to do so in Tour history
- Collected second DP World Tour title at 2022 Ras Al Khaimah Championship, shooting 24-under to beat Jordan Smith by four strokes

Sam Stevens (T1/-14)

- PGA TOUR rookie is making his tournament debut looking to become the second rookie to win on TOUR this season (Nico Echavarria/Puerto Rico Open)
- Holds his first lead/co-lead on TOUR after any round; sat T2 through 36 holes; best position after any round on TOUR prior to this week: T3/R3/2023 Puerto Rico Open (T15)
- Former Oklahoma State golf seeks his first career PGA TOUR title in his 16th start (best: T13/2023 Farmers Insurance Open)
- Played two TOUR events in 2022 before his rookie 2022-23 season (T55/The Honda Classic, T49/U.S. Open); shot 65, chipping in for eagle at his final hole, in the Monday qualifier to advance to his TOUR debut at 2022 Honda Classic
- Won the 2021 Holcim Colombia Classic on PGA TOUR Latinoamerica
- Won three times on the All Pro Tour in 2020 season and captured the money title with more than \$100,000 in earnings
- Texas native lives in Kansas and was born on Independence Day
- Third-generation professional golfer; grandfather, Johnny, made 30 PGA TOUR starts in the 1960s; father, Charlie, made two Korn Ferry Tour starts in 1992

Miscellaneous Notes

- Thomas Detry (T3/-13), the highest-ranked player in the field at No. 82 in the Official World Golf Ranking, owns a 69.68 scoring average for 19 rounds at the Corales course; extends his streak of par-or-better rounds at this event to 19; making fifth-consecutive tournament start (T33/2019, T33/2020, T13/2021, T15/2022)
- Wyndham Clark (T3/-13) is the only player in the field with three eagles this week (No. 7/R3, No. 4/R2, No. 4/R1)
- Tyler Duncan (T3/-13) birdies Nos. 17 and 18 to sit two strokes back in search of his second TOUR title (2019 RSM Classic)
- 36-hole leader **Matt Wallace** (T3/-13) seeks first career PGA TOUR title in his 80th start; owns four DP World Tour titles, three of them coming in 2018
- Martin Trainer's (T7/-12) bogey on No. 18 to shoot 7-under 65 marks his first dropped shot on the back nine this week; 2019 Puerto Rico Open winner has three career top-10s in 116 starts on TOUR, including a T7 at this event in 2022 (T5/2021 Houston Open)
- Austin Eckroat (T7/-12), who entered this week with six consecutive missed cuts on TOUR, posts six birdies and an eagle (No. 7) for a front-nine 28 (-8) en route to a 6-under 66; 28 marks the lowest 9-hole score in tournament history and ties the low 9-hole score on TOUR this season; his 7-under birdie/eagle streak (B-B-B-E-B, Holes 3-8) is a tournament record and matches the best on TOUR this season (Davis Thompson/The American Express)
- 2009 U.S. Open runner-up **Ricky Barnes** (T7/-12) seeks his first TOUR victory in his 338th start; since 1970, the player with the most starts before his first TOUR win is Brad Bryant (468)
- Past champions in the field: Brice Garnett (10th/-10), Joel Dahmen (T45/-3), Chad Ramey (WD after R1)
- Two players have made the cut in all six editions of the Corales Puntacana Championship
