Things to Know

- Sam Ryder holds the 36-hole lead/co-lead for the first time in his 147th start on TOUR
- Three-stroke lead ties second-largest 36-hole lead this season
- In his 11th appearance at Farmers Insurance Open, Brendan Steele seeks his fourth title on TOUR
- With 5-under 67, Tano Goya shares low round of the day with Jon Rahm, both at the North Course
- With rounds of 73-67, 2017 champion Jon Rahm extends the longest active cuts-made streak to 22
- Three of the last four winners of the Farmers Insurance Open began the tournament on the North Course; every winner from 2011-2018 started on the South Course
- Second-round scoring average at South Course: 75.895 after 72.218 in round one; North Course: R2/73.179, R1/69.731

- Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win the Farmers Insurance Open since 2000 (Phil Mickelson/2000/2001, Tiger Woods/2008/2013, Justin Rose/2019)
- 4 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win on TOUR in 2022-23 (most recent: Tony Finau/Cadence Bank Houston Open)

- Holds the 36-hole lead/co-lead for the first time in his 147th start on TOUR; was T2 twice after 36 holes in individual events, eventually finishing fifth at the 2018 Cadence Bank Houston Open and T8 at the 2022 World Wide Technology Championship
- Three-stroke lead ties second-largest 36-hole lead this season (4 strokes/Tony Finau/Cadence Bank Houston Open)
- Third time in six starts at Farmers Insurance Open to begin with back-to-back rounds under par (2019, 2021, 2023)
- One top-10 in five prior starts at the Farmers Insurance Open (T10/2021)
- One top-10 in nine starts during the 2022-23 season (T8/World Wide Technology Championship)
- Two-time runner-up on TOUR (T2/2018 John Deere Classic, T2/2021 Corales Puntacana Championship)
- With a win, would join Adam Svensson (The RSM Classic) as the second first-time winner this season
- With a win, would become first player since J.J. Spaun (2022 Valero Texas Open) to win on TOUR after victories on PGA TOUR Canada and the Korn Ferry Tour

Miscellaneous notes

- Three-time TOUR winner **Brendan Steele** (2nd/-9) seeks first top-10 in 11th appearance at this event; T17 in his tournament debut in 2011 marks his best result at this event; T18 at the THE CJ CUP in South Carolina marks his best finish in seven starts this season
- PGA TOUR rookie **Tano Goya** (3rd/-7), making his 14th TOUR start and ninth this season, has yet to post a top-25 result on TOUR; best finish came last week at The American Express (T26); Argentine owns one win on the DP World Tour (2009 Madeira Islands Open)
- PGA TOUR rookie **Taylor Montgomery** (T4/-6) looks to collect his ninth top-15 finish in his 10th start this season (T57/Cadence Bank Houston Open); finished T11 at this event in 2022 and T57 at the 2021 U.S. Open played at Torrey Pines (South)
- First-round co-leader Brent Grant (T4/-6) included a triple-bogey (7) at No. 14 on the South Course en route to 2-over 74
- Sahith Theegala's (T4/-6) even-par 72 on the South Course ended his streak of 14 consecutive under-par scores on TOUR
- With a win, Fortinet Championship winner **Max Homa** (T4/-6) would join Jon Rahm as the second multiple winner this season in as many weeks
- PGA TOUR rookie **Sam Stevens** (T4/-6) makes the cut in back-to-back starts for the first time this season (67th/The American Express)
- PGA TOUR rookie **Vincent Norrman** (T4/-6) had made two cuts in seven starts on TOUR before advancing to the third round at Torrey Pines his first event (T36/2022 Fortinet Championship) and his most recent start (T54/The American Express)
- On Australia Day, Australian **Jason Day** (T10/-5), a two-time winner of this event, posts his seventh consecutive round of par-or-better at this event 72-70-65-67-72-68-71
- After sitting T116 following an opening-round 73, **Jon Rahm** (T14/-4) shoots 5-under 67 to extend the longest active cutsmade streak on TOUR (22); last missed cut: 2021 Fortinet Championship; eagle on the par-5 fifth hole (NC) marked his ninth eagle at the Farmers Insurance Open, the most of any player since 2017
- Defending champion **Luke List** (T24/-2) follows first-round 67 with 75 (SC); last player to successfully defend his title at the event: Tiger Woods (won four consecutive from 2005 to 2008)
- After missing the cut in four of his first five starts at his hometown event, San Diego native **Xander Schauffele** (T36/-1) advances to the third round for the third time in a row at Torrey Pines
- After making the cut at the Korn Ferry Tour's The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic, **Scott Brown** (T54/E) learned he got into the Farmers Insurance Open when John Huh withdrew on Monday; Brown withdrew from the Korn Ferry Tour and made the cut on the number at Torrey Pines with 69-75
- Japan's **Taiga Semikawa** (T54/E) began round two with an eagle on No. 10 at the North Course and added another at No. 5 en route to 2-under 70, making the cut for the second time in three starts on TOUR; was the only player with two eagles in the second round
