Lucas Glover (Winner/-15)

- Wins sixth PGA TOUR title, and second in as many weeks, in his 513th start at the age of 43 years, 9 months, 1 day
- Moves up 45 spots from No. 49 to No. 4 in the FedExCup standings, qualifying for next week's BMW Championship for the third consecutive season and ninth total; career-high finish in the FedExCup: 17th (2009)
- **PGA TOUR wins (6):** 2005 FUNAI Classic at the Walt Disney World Resort, 2009 U.S. Open, 2011 Wells Fargo Championship, 2021 John Deere Classic, 2023 Wyndham Championship, 2023 FedEx St. Jude Championship
- First multiple win season since joining the TOUR in 2004
- Becomes the eighth player with multiple wins this season (others: 4/Jon Rahm, 2/Keegan Bradley, 2/Wyndham Clark, 2/Tony Finau, 2/Max Homa, 2/Rory McIlroy, 2/Scottie Scheffler)
- Becomes first player 40 years or older to win back-to-back tournaments on TOUR since Vijay Singh in 2008 (2008 FedEx St. Jude Championship, 2008 Deutsche Bank Championship)
- Improves to 2-for-5 converting the third-round lead/co-lead to victory on the PGA TOUR (2023 Wyndham Championship)
- Becomes the first 54-hole leader/co-leader 40 years or older to win a FedExCup Playoffs since Tiger Woods at the 2018 TOUR Championship (42 years old)
- Final-round 21-under 69 is his 22nd consecutive par-or-better round on TOUR (95-under total in his last six starts)
- Moves from No. 53 to No. 30 in the Official World Golf Ranking

Miscellaneous Notes

- Eight-time TOUR winner **Patrick Cantlay** (P2/-15) earns his 10th runner-up on TOUR and falls to 3-for-4 in playoffs; enters next week's BMW Championship as the two-time defending champion and has won three of the last six FedExCup Playoffs events (2021 TOUR Championship/2021 BMW Championship/2022 BMW Championship)
- **Tommy Fleetwood** (T3/-14) earns 22nd top-five finish on TOUR and becomes the first player in PGA TOUR history to surpass \$20 million in official career earnings without a victory on TOUR
- FedExCup leader **Jon Rahm** (T37/-5) holds a 148-FedExCup point lead over No. 2 **Scottie Scheffler** (T31)
- Four players will make their debut at the BMW Championship next week: **Adam Schenk** (20), **Adam Svensson** (39), **Eric Cole** (42), **Patrick Rodgers** (50); Cole marks the only rookie to advance to the BMW Championship
