TOP STORYLINES

The 2023 Fortinet Championship is the first event of the FedExCup Fall, a group of seven tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2024 PGA TOUR Season. Nos. 1-50 in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions while Nos. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points over. Nos. 51-60 through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2024: AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational.

Winners of events during the FedExCup Fall receive the same benefits of winners of Full-Field Events during the Regular Season, including 500 FedExCup points, Official World Golf Ranking points, a two-year PGA TOUR exemption (exempt thru 2025) and invitations to The Sentry, THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament and PGA Championship.

Although players in the top 50 are not earning FedExCup points, their points are not redistributed; for example, if Max Homa (No. 6) finishes solo-second and Mackenzie Hughes (No. 51) finishes solo-third, Hughes receives the usual 190 points for third place, not the 300 points for second place.

Looking for a three-peat: World No. 7 Max Homa, the highest-ranked player in the field, is in search of his third consecutive victory at the Fortinet Championship. The last player to win the same PGA TOUR event in three consecutive years is Steve Stricker at the John Deere Classic in 2009, 2010 and 2011. Homa is the sixth player to compete on TOUR this season as the two-time defending champion and three of the previous five finished in the top 10.

Six players in the field qualified for the BMW Championship: Max Homa (No. 6 in the FedExCup standings), Sahith Theegala (No. 31), Andrew Putnam (No. 35), Eric Cole (No. 43), Brendon Todd (No. 47) and Cam Davis (No. 48).

11 other players in the field qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs: Mackenzie Hughes (No. 51), Nick Hardy (No. 52), Taylor Montgomery (No. 53), Stephan Jaeger (No. 56), Beau Hossler (No. 58), Sam Ryder (No. 61), J.J. Spaun (No. 62), Sam Stevens (No. 65), Matt Kuchar (No. 66), Mark Hubbard (No. 67) and Matt NeSmith (No. 70).

Five players in the field have won a tournament this season: Akshay Bhatia (Barracuda Championship), Nico Echavarria (Puerto Rico Open), Nick Hardy (Zurich Classic of New Orleans), Max Homa (2022 Fortinet Championship, Farmers Insurance Open) and Mackenzie Hughes (2022 Sanderson Farms Championship).

Rookie of the year race: The Jack Nicklaus Award (PGA TOUR Player of the Year) and Arnold Palmer Award (PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year) will be voted on after the FedExCup Fall. Eric Cole is the only rookie that advanced to the BMW Championship, while five others qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs (Thomas Detry, Taylor Montgomery, Sam Stevens, Vincent Norman, Ben Griffin). Cole, Montgomery and Stevens lead a group of 24 rookies in the field, which includes Special Temporary Members Ryan Gerard and Peter Kuest.

500th start: Aaron Baddeley is making his 500th start on the PGA TOUR, becoming the first player to reach that milestone since Lucas Glover at the 2023 Valero Texas Open. Baddeley is also making his 16th start at the Fortinet Championship, tied with Chris Stroud for the most in tournament history. He has one top-10 at the event (T4/2018) and got into the field last year as an Open Qualifier (T36).

ADDITIONAL STORYLINES

Justin Thomas returns to the Fortinet Championship: Thomas is making his sixth start at the Fortinet Championship and first since 2019. He has finished in the top 10 in each of his last three appearances at the event (T3/2015, T8/2016, T4/2019). At No. 71 in the FedExCup standings through the Wyndham Championship, Thomas missed the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time in his career in 2023. He won on the PGA TOUR in each of the previous seven seasons and can extend his streak to eight with a win this week, which would be the longest active streak on TOUR. Among players in the field, Thomas has the most PGA TOUR wins (15), is the only past FedExCup Champion (2017) and is the most recent PLAYERS Championship winner (2021) and major winner (2022 PGA Championship).

Ryder Cup: There are two players in the field that will compete in the Ryder Cup (September 29-October 1), both for the United States: Max Homa and Justin Thomas. Homa is making his Ryder Cup debut after going 4-0-0 in his Presidents Cup debut in 2022. Thomas will make his third consecutive appearance in the event. The United States will also be represented by Captain Zach Johnson and Vice Captain Stewart Cink. Homa and Cink have combined to win the last three titles at the Fortinet Championship (Cink/2020, Homa/2021, Homa/22).

Kisner returns: Four-time PGA TOUR winner Kevin Kisner is making his first start on TOUR since withdrawing during the first round of the 2023 Travelers Championship. Kisner has made 15 starts this season, with his best result coming at The RSM Classic (T29).

PGA TOUR University: 2023 NCAA Division I National Championship winner Fred Biondi is making his first start as a professional on the PGA TOUR. Biondi, from the University of Florida, finished No. 2 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2023 and has made nine starts on the Korn Ferry Tour since turning professional in May, with his best result coming at the BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNNEX (T31). Biondi missed the cut at the 2022 U.S. Open in his only start on TOUR as an amateur. A native of Sao Paulo, Biondi competes under the flag of Brazil. The last PGA TOUR member from Brazil was Lucas Lee, who made 16 starts during the 2015-16 season.

PGA TOUR Canada: Hayden Springer, who won two of the final three PGA TOUR Canada events of the season, earned a sponsor exemption by finishing the season No. 1 in the Fortinet Cup standings. Springer, the 2023 PGA TOUR Canada Player of the Year, earns fully exempt status on the Korn Ferry Tour for 2024 and an exemption into the final stage of PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry. This is Springer's fourth start on the PGA TOUR and first since the 2021 U.S. Open (MC). He got into the 2016 FedEx St. Jude Classic via the Open Qualfier at age 19 (MC).

Duplicate events: As part of the PGA TOUR's return to a calendar-based schedule in 2024, all seven events in the FedExCup Fall will be played twice as part of the 2022-23 season. The last PGA TOUR season that had events played multiple times was 2020-21, when the 2020 Corales Puntacana Championship, Masters Tournament and U.S. Open were moved to the fall of 2020 due to COVID-19.
