Rory McIlroy (Winner/-15)

- Wins the Genesis Scottish Open by one stroke over Robert MacIntyre, earning his 24th PGA TOUR title and second of the season; the victory comes in his 234th start at the age of 34 years, 2 months, 12 days
- Ties Dustin Johnson and Gary Player for 26th on the all-time PGA TOUR wins list
- Becomes the seventh player with multiple wins this season (others: 4/Jon Rahm, 2/Keegan Bradley, 2/Wyndham Clark, 2/Tony Finau, 2/Max Homa, 2/Scottie Scheffler)
- Moves to No. 3 in the FedExCup standings and No. 2 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Becomes the first player to win the Genesis Scottish Open (2023), Horizon Irish Open (2016) and The Open Championship (2014)
- Improves to 11-for-19 to date with the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (1-for-3 this season) and becomes the 21st thirdround leader/co-leader to win on TOUR this season (first since Rickie Fowler/Rocket Mortgage Classic)
- Birdies Nos. 17 and 18 in the final round to win by one stroke; only other player in the field to birdie each of those holes in a round was Scottie Scheffler in the third round
- Six consecutive top-10s (T7/PGA Championship, T7/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, T9/RBC Canadian Open, 2nd/U.S. Open, T7/Travelers Championship, Won/Genesis Scottish Open), his longest such streak since he had seven straight in his last seven starts before the 2019-20 season was suspended due to COVID-19
- The Open Championship will be held at Royal Liverpool next week for the first time since McIlroy's victory in 2014
- Last player to win the week prior to a major championship then win major championship: Rory McIlroy, 2014 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational the week before 2014 PGA Championship

Miscellaneous notes

- **Robert McIntyre** (2nd) earns the best finish by a Scottish player on the PGA TOUR since Martin Laird won the 2020 Shriners Children's Open and collects enough non-member FedExCup points (300) to become eligible for Special Temporary Membership on the PGA TOUR
- Scottie Scheffler (T3) earns his seventh consecutive top-five on the PGA TOUR and 18th straight result of T12 or better; Scheffler's Official Money total of \$19,016,842 is the highest in a single season in PGA TOUR history
- David Lingmerth (T3), Byeong Hun An (T3) and Nicolai Hojgaard (T6) qualify for The Open Championship as the top three finishers not otherwise exempt
- Lingmerth records his best finish on the PGA TOUR since a playoff loss at the 2016 American Express
- Tom Kim (T6) and Tommy Fleetwood (T6) are the only two players to finish in the top 10 in each of the last two years of the Genesis Scottish Open; Kim finished solo-third in 2022 and Fleetwood finished T4
