In the 2021-2022 season, she was named to the second team of the WCGA NAIA All-American team. Additionally, Malisone was named as one of this year's 2022-23 Daktronics NAIA Women's Golf Scholar-Athletes. She also is defending champion for three collegiate tournaments in the 2022-2023 season and hold individual records for 18-, 36-, and 54-rounds, 64, 66-69, and 66-69-70 respectively. She'll continue to play for the team as a grad student. In graduate school, Malisone plans to focus on data analytics and supply chain management. When asked about her career goals, Malisone emphasized that she aims create more sustainable and clean ways that do not harm the planet and hopes that a career path in either of these categories: finance, accounting, data analytics, supply chain management, or computer science align with these goals. Malisone is a lifetime First Tee participant, having joined the program almost 14 years ago. She was also the youngest participant to ever achieve ACE Certification in the Fort Worth chapter's history. She served on the Chapter Junior Advisory Committee and played in both the 2021 First Tee National Championship and in the Pure Insurance Open at Pebble Beach. Malisone continues to be involved in her chapter serving as a part time coach.
