Completed Second-Round Notes – Saturday, April 8, 2023

Weather: Friday: Mostly cloudy with scattered showers in the afternoon. High of 79. Wind SSW 5-10 mph. **Saturday morning:** Cloudy with showers. High of 48. Wind NE 14-18 mph, with gusts to 25 mph.

Suspensions and resumptions of play: Play was suspended on Friday at 3:07 p.m. ET due to inclement weather conditions and resumed at 3:28 p.m., ending a delay of 21 minutes. Play was suspended for a second time due to inclement weather conditions at 4:22 p.m. ET and did not resume Friday (39 players left to complete the round). The second round resumed at 8 a.m. Saturday and was completed at 10:51 a.m.

Third-round starting times: 11:30 a.m. – 1:06 p.m. ET in threesomes off Nos. 1 and 10.

36-hole cut: 53 professionals and one amateur at 3-over 147 from a field of 80 professionals and seven amateurs

Things to Know

- Four-time major champion Brooks Koepka records a 36-hole total of 132 (-12), tied for third-lowest in tournament history, and holds his fourth career 36-hole lead/co-lead in major championships
- FedExCup leader and first-round co-leader Jon Rahm is two strokes back after carding his career-low 36-hole score in a major (134)
- Two players are 10-under or better through 36 holes for the first time in tournament history (Koepka, Rahm)
- 2022 U.S. Amateur champion Sam Bennett (8-under 136) records the second-lowest 36-hole score by an amateur in tournament history (lowest: 135, Ken Venturi, 1956)
- 82-time PGA TOUR winner and five-time Masters champion Tiger Woods makes the cut on the number and ties the record for most consecutive cuts made in tournament history with 23, joining Gary Player and Fred Couples
- Couples (T40) becomes the oldest player in tournament history to make the cut at age 63 years, 6 months, 5 days
- Rory McIlroy and Justin Thomas miss the cut in the same major championship for the first time (29th played together)

- Fourth career 36-hole lead/co-lead in major championships (2-for-3 to date) and second at the Masters
- Also held the lead/co-lead after each of the first two rounds in 2019 (finished T2)
- 12-under 132 ties the third-lowest score through two rounds in tournament history

- Third career 36-hole score of 132 or better in majors (won the previous two instances)
- Four-time major champion (2017 U.S. Open, 2018 U.S. Open, 2018 PGA Championship, 2019 PGA Championship)

Jon Rahm (2nd/-10)

- Career-low 36-hole score in a major championship (134); previous: 135, three times (most recent: 2021 Open Championship; finished T3)
- Second-best 36-hole position in a major championship (T1, 2020 Masters; finished T7)
- Holds the lead in the FedExCup standings with three victories this season (Scottie Scheffler entered the 2022 Masters as the FedExCup leader with three victories on the season and went on to win)
- Four top-10s at the Masters, tied with Rory McIlroy and Cameron Smith for most of any player since Rahm made his tournament debut in 2017

Sam Bennett (3rd/-8)

- Second-lowest 36-hole score by an amateur at the Masters Tournament (lowest: 135, Ken Venturi, 1956)
- First amateur inside the top three after 36 holes at the Masters since Ricky Barnes in 2003 (T3)
- First amateur inside the top three after 36 holes in a major since Jin Jeong at the 2010 Open Championship (T3)
- First amateur inside the top three after 36 holes in a TOUR event since Jared du Toit at the 2016 RBC Canadian Open (T3)
- Making fourth career PGA TOUR start (best result to date: T49, 2022 U.S. Open)
- No. 6 in PGA TOUR University Ranking (senior at Texas A&M)

Miscellaneous notes

- Defending champion and World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** cards a 3-over 75, snapping a streak of seven consecutive under-par scores at the Masters; Scheffler's 75 is his highest score in a round on TOUR since the second round of the 2022 PGA Championship (75)
- 82-time PGA TOUR winner and five-time Masters champion **Tiger Woods** makes his 23rd consecutive cut at the Masters, tying Gary Player (1959-1982) and Fred Couples (1983-2007) for most consecutive cuts made in tournament history; Woods has not missed a cut at the Masters since 1996, his final start in the tournament before turning professional
- 1992 Masters champion **Fred Couples** (T40/+1) becomes the oldest player in tournament history to make the cut at age 63 years, 6 months, 5 days; the record was previously held by Bernhard Langer (63 years, 2 months, 18 days in 2020)
- **Rory McIlroy** cards a second-round 77 and misses the cut at the Masters for the third time (2010, 2021, 2023)
- **Justin Thomas** makes bogey at Nos. 17 and 18 to miss the cut by a stroke (first missed cut in eight starts at the Masters)
- **Louis Oosthuizen** WD during the second round due to injury
