#### Things to Know

- Tony Finau seeks his sixth PGA TOUR title and fourth since finishing runner-up at this event last year
- Finau's score of 13-under 129 sets a 36-hole tournament record
- With a win, South Africa's Erik van Rooyen would join Spain's Jon Rahm as the second international winner of this event
- Brandon Wu seeks first TOUR title; finished T2 (with Tony Finau and Kurt Kitayama) at this event in 2022
- Andrew Putnam is the only PGA TOUR winner among the five players at 9-under
- Mexico's Raul Pereda sits T12 at 7-under in his PGA TOUR debut while playing on a sponsor exemption
- Defending champion and World No. 1 Jon Rahm sits T12, six strokes back at 7-under

# Tony Finau (1<sup>st</sup>/-13)

- Follows opening-round 65 with 64 to sit 13-under 129; last time he was better than 129 through 36 holes he went on to win (127, 2022 Cadence Bank Houston Open)
- Holds the 36-hole lead/co-lead for the fifth time on TOUR, converting for the win once (2022 Cadence Bank Houston Open); also held a share of the 36-hole lead with teammate Cameron Champ at 2021 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (T17)
- Hits 16 of 18 greens in regulation for the second consecutive day to rank No. 1 in Greens in Regulation
- Marks his third round of 64 or better this season (62/R2/Cadence Bank Houston Open, 64/R3/Farmers Insurance Open)
- Has made 11 cuts in 12 events this season; his two most recent starts mark his only finishes outside the top-25 this season (T26/Masters Tournament, T31/RBC Heritage)
- Second-highest ranked player in the field at No. 16 is one of four players in the field that has won on TOUR this season (Nico Echavarria, Jon Rahm, Matt Wallace)

- Posted a final-round 63 to finish T2 at this event last year

## **Miscellaneous notes**

- Erik van Rooyen (T2/-12) owns two top-10s in 13 starts this season (T6/The American Express, T10/Valspar Championship); seeks his second PGA TOUR title (2021 Barracuda Championship)
- Brandon Wu (T2/-12) closes with three consecutive birdies en route to 7-under 64; owns two runner-up results in 56 starts on TOUR, including T2 at this event last year when he posted a final-round 63 (T2/2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am); is 25-under in his last four rounds at Vidanta Vallarta (66-63 on the weekend in 2022); leads the field in Driving Accuracy, hitting 24 of 26 fairways
- Andrew Putnam (T4/-9) is 8-under on the back nine this week; owns two top-five finishes this season (T2/ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, T4/Sony Open in Hawaii)
- Will Gordon (T4/-9) is one of three players with just one bogey through 36 holes (Austin Smotherman, Jimmy Walker); seeks his second top-10 this season, with his first coming in Mexico (T3/World Wide Technology Championship)
- Making his first appearance at this event, Eric Cole (T4/-9) sits in his best position through 36 holes in his 21<sup>st</sup> start on TOUR (previous: T5/2023 Honda Classic/finished P2)
- With a win, first-round leader **Austin Smotherman** (T4/-9) would join 10 players who have won titles on a Pathway Tour (PGA TOUR Latinoamerica, PGA TOUR Canada, PGA TOUR Series-China), Korn Ferry Tour and PGA TOUR; won the 2018 Abierto Mexicano de Golf in Tijuana on PGA TOUR Latinoamerica and the 2020 Simmons Bank Open for the Snedeker Foundation on the Korn Ferry Tour
- Akshay Bhatia (T4/-9) has not made a bogey on the front nine this week
- Cameron Champ (T9/-8), who finished T6 at this event last year, opens with two rounds in the 60s for the first time on TOUR since October at the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP; before this week, his most recent sub-70 round on TOUR was November (69/R2/World Wide Technology Championship)
- Defending champion and World No. 1 **Jon Rahm** (T12/-7) posts an eagle at the par-5 sixth hole, his 13<sup>th</sup> eagle this season, tied most of any player; double-bogey at the par-3 ninth hole marked his first double bogey in 99 holes at Vidanta Vallarta
- Making his PGA TOUR debut as a sponsor exemption, Mexico's Raul Pereda (T12/-7) bogeys his final two holes en route to 1-under 70; holes out from 249 yards at No. 16 (his seventh hole); 249 yards is the longest hole-out by any player on TOUR this season
- After starting with five consecutive birdies, **Scott Piercy** (T25/-5) was 9-under through 15 holes and threatening to break the tournament 18-hole scoring record (63) before finishing double bogey-bogey; his two lowest rounds this season have come in Mexico (64/R1/World Wide Technology Championship, 65/R2/Mexico Open at Vidanta)
- Two of the seven players from Mexico advance to the weekend Raul Pereda (T12/-7) and Sebastian Vazquez (T62/-2)
