Things to Know

- Tony Finau wins his sixth PGA TOUR title and fourth in his last 18 starts
- Finau earns multiple victories in back-to-back seasons for the first time in his career
- World No. 1 and FedExCup leader Jon Rahm posts his ninth career runner-up finish
- Rahm sets the new record for most Official Money earned in a single season
- 2022 Mexico Open at Vidanta runner-up Brandon Wu finishes solo third
- Finau, Rahm and Wu all finished inside the top three at the 2022 Mexico Open at Vidanta

- Sixth PGA TOUR victory in his 229th start at the age of 33 years, 7 months, 16 days
- PGA TOUR wins (6): 2016 Puerto Rico Open, 2021 FedEx St. Jude Championship, 2022 3M Open, 2022 Rocket Mortgage Classic, 2022 Cadence Bank Houston Open, 2023 Mexico Open at Vidanta
- Earns 500 FedExCup points and moves to No. 4 in the FedExCup standings
- Moves from No. 16 to No. 11 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Fourth multiple winner this season (Jon Rahm, Max Homa, Scottie Scheffler); earns multiple victories in back-to-back seasons for the first time in his career
- 3-for-8 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (2022 Rocket Mortgage Classic, 2022 Cadence Bank Houston Open, 2023 Mexico Open at Vidanta)
- After one win in his first 188 career starts on TOUR, has won five times in 41 starts, including four in his last 18 dating back to the 2022 3M Open
- 24-under 260 total marks his lowest 72-hole score and second-lowest score in relation to par in 229 career starts (-26/2022 Rocket Mortgage Classic)
- Wins in his second appearance at the Mexico Open at Vidanta after posting a final-round 63 to finish T2 (2022)
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (14.779) and Total Birdies (27)

Jon Rahm (2nd/-21)

- Ninth career runner-up finish on TOUR
- Has finished T7 or higher in eight of 11 stroke-play events this season
- Best finish in seven career title defenses on TOUR

- Sets the TOUR record for most Official Money earned in a single season with \$14,462,840 (previous: \$14,046,910/Scottie Scheffler/2021-22)

Miscellaneous notes

- 2022 Mexico Open at Vidanta runner-up **Brandon Wu** (3rd/-19) finishes solo third for his second top-10 in 20 starts this season (T2/2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am); held a share of the lead following an eagle on the par-5 sixth hole from 44'5" and led the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (8.427)
- PGA TOUR Special Temporary Member **Akshay Bhatia** (4th/-18) cards a 70 to post his third career top-10 in his 28th start on TOUR, including his second this season (2nd/2023 Puerto Rico Open); has unlimited sponsor exemptions for the remainder of the season as he seeks his PGA TOUR card for the 2024 season
- Making his third career PGA TOUR start as a sponsor exemption, Argentina's **Alejandro Tosti** (T10/-13) makes two eagles (Nos. 18 and 6) for a 64; qualifies for next week's Wells Fargo Championship with the T10 finish
