Additional Notes

- Oak Hill's East Course is the only one in America that has hosted all six rotating men's golf championships (U.S. Am-1949, 98, 2027, U.S. Open-1956, 68, 89, PGA-1980, 2003, 13, 23, U.S. Sr. Open-1984, Ryder Cup-1995, Sr. PGA-2008, 19).
- Other than three years in Boston (2000-03), Jeff Corcoran has been at Oak Hill since an internship in 1994. He has been involved in seven of the events listed above.
- The 2019 restoration included replacing the old bentgrass/*Poa annua* greens with pure bentgrass, restoring shapes and contours of greens, extensive tree removal, bunker removal and relocations, adding new back tees, and a new drainage system.
