Things to Know

- Brooks Koepka earns fifth career major championship title and third PGA Championship victory (2018, 2019, 2023)
- Scottie Scheffler earns second career runner-up in a major and returns to No. 1 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Viktor Hovland finishes top 10 for third straight major; only player in field to post four rounds at even-par or better
- Scheffler, Hovland are only two players to finish in the top 10 in first three 600-point FedExCup events of season
 - Scheffler: Win/THE PLAYERS Championship, T10/Masters Tournament, T2/PGA Championship
 - o Hovland: T3/THE PLAYERS Championship, T7/Masters Tournament, T2/PGA Championship
- Michael Block records best finish by PGA professional since 1986; T15 guarantees spot in 2024 PGA Championship
- Cam Davis, Kurt Kitayama, Scheffler, Cameron Smith, Sepp Straka record tournament-low rounds (65)
- Min Woo Lee, Ryan Fox earn Special Temporary Membership on the PGA TOUR

Brooks Koepka (1st/-9)

- Fifth major championship title: 2017 U.S. Open, 2018 U.S. Open, 2018 PGA Championship, 2019 PGA Championship, 2023 PGA Championship
- 4-for-5 in converting 54-hole leads/co-leads in a major to victory: 2018 U.S. Open/Won, 2018 PGA Championship/Won, 2019 PGA Championship/Won, 2023 Masters Tournament/T2, 2023 PGA Championship/Won
- 20th player to win five or more major championship titles
- Sixth player with five major wins; joins Seve Ballesteros, James Braid, Byron Nelson, J.H. Taylor and Peter Thomson
- Sixth player to win three or more PGA Championship titles

Scottie Scheffler (T2/-7)

- Entered the final round four shots off lead and ties career-low score in a major: 65/R3/2020 PGA Championship
- Returns to World No. 1 for the first time since entering the 2023 Masters Tournament
- Third top-10 in four PGA Championship starts: T2/2023, T4/2020, T8/2021
- Second career runner-up in a major: 2nd/2023 PGA Championship, T2/2022 U.S. Open
- Eighth top-10 and fourth top-five in 15th major championship start
- Records TOUR-best 10th top-10 of the season, and seventh in last nine starts: Win/WM Phoenix Open, T4/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, Win/THE PLAYERS Championship, 4th/WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, T10/Masters Tournament, T5/AT&T Byron Nelson, 2nd/PGA Championship
- Second consecutive tournament with final-round 65 (AT&T Byron Nelson)

Viktor Hovland (T2/-7)

- Entered the final round one shot off lead; records career-best finish in a major in 14th major start
- Third career top-10 in a major and third in as many starts (T2/2023 PGA Championship, T7/2023 Masters Tournament, T4/2022 Open Championship); the only player to finish in the top 10 in the last three majors
- Held a lead/co-lead in the last three majors: 2022 Open Championship/R3/finished T4, 2023 Masters Tournament/R1/Finished T7, 2023 PGA Championship/R2/T2
- Sixth top-10 of the season and third top-five: T2/PGA Championship, T3/THE PLAYERS, T5/ZOZO Championship
- A three-time PGA TOUR winner; only player from Norway to win on the PGA TOUR: 2020 Puerto Rico Open, 2021 World Wide Technology Championship, 2022 World Wide Technology Championship

Additional Player Notes

- Cam Davis (T4), Kurt Kitayama (T4) and Sepp Straka (T7) each earn their first top-10 in a major
- Min Woo Lee (T18) and Ryan Fox (T23) earn Special Temporary Membership on the PGA TOUR; now eligible to
 accept an unlimited number of sponsor exemptions in attempt to earn full status on the PGA TOUR for the 2024
 season by earning as many or more non-member FedExCup points as No. 125 in the final 2022-23 FedExCup
 Playoffs and Eligibility Points List (thru the 2023 FedExCup Fall).
- 2012 and 2014 PGA Championship winner Rory Mcllroy (T7) records eighth top-10 in his 15th PGA Championship start; marks fifth top-10 in last six majors: T7/2023 PGA Championship, MC/2023 Masters Tournament, T5/2022 U.S. Open, 8th/2022 PGA Championship, 2nd/2022 Masters Tournament
- PGA professional **Michael Block** (T15) records best finish by PGA professional since 1986; records hole-in-one with a 7-iron at the par-3 15th from 151 yards; marks the 29th ace at the PGA Championship (since 1983) and first since Byeong Hun An/R4/2020; by finishing in the top 15, earns a spot in the 2024 PGA Championship
- In his 30th major start, defending champion **Justin Thomas** (T65) posts rounds of 72-73-75-72 marking the first time he has posted four over-par rounds in a major
- In his seventh attempt to complete the Career Grand Slam, Jordan Spieth finishes T29
- Entering the final round one shot off the lead, 36-hole co-leader **Corey Conners** (T12) records a 5-over 75, his highest final round on TOUR since the 2021 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (77)
