2022 Presidents Cup: Round Two Results and Notes

Things to Know

- U.S. Team earns four points for the second consecutive round and leads the International Team 8-2 entering Round Three
- Justin Thomas, playing with Jordan Spieth, becomes the only player in Presidents Cup history to win his first five Four-ball matches
- Patrick Cantlay/Xander Schauffele def. Hideki Matsuyama/Tom Kim, 3 and 2; Cantlay and Schauffele have now played six matches together at the Presidents Cup, which is tied for second-most in event history
- Playing with Billy Horschel in the final match of the day, Presidents Cup rookie Max Homa makes an 11-foot birdie at No. 18 to win 1-up against Corey Connors/Taylor Pendrith
- Year-by-year scores after Round Two since the format for the first two rounds changed to five points each in 2015:
 - 2015: U.S. 5½, INT 4½
 - 2017: U.S. 8, INT 2
 - 2019: INT 6½, U.S. 3½
 - 2022: U.S. 8, INT 2

Match 11: Jordan Spieth/Justin Thomas (U.S.) vs. Sungjae Im/Corey Connors (INT)

Match 12: Cameron Young/Collin Morikawa (U.S.) vs. Adam Scott/Hideki Matsuyama (INT)

Match 13: Scottie Scheffler/Sam Burns (U.S.) vs. K.H. Lee/Tom Kim (INT)

Match 14: Tony Finau/Max Homa (U.S.) vs. Si Woo Kim/Cam Davis (INT)

Match 6: Jordan Spieth/Justin Thomas (U.S.) def. Adam Scott/Cam Davis (INT), 2 and 1

- Thomas becomes the only player in Presidents Cup history to win his first five Four-ball matches

- Clinching putt: 19 feet, 10 inches for birdie (3) by Spieth on No. 17
- Adam Scott records the 10th Four-ball loss of his Presidents Cup career, breaking a tie with Tiger Woods (9) for most all-time
- 46th match played by Adam Scott (second-most in Presidents Cup history; most: 55, Phil Mickelson)

Match 7: Scottie Scheffler/Sam Burns (U.S.) tie Sungjae Im/Sebastian Munoz (INT)

- Im/Munoz win 13 and 17 to rally from 2-down to secure the first points of the day for the International Team
- Scheffler missed a birdie putt for the outright win from 9 feet on the 18th hole
- Burns' 79-foot, 10-inch putt at No. 7 was longer than any putt in his PGA TOUR career (prior longest was 75 feet, 10 inches on No. 16 during Rd. 2 at the 2022 PLAYERS Championship)
- Scheffler was named 2022 PGA TOUR Player of the Year after winning four times (including the Masters Tournament) during the 2021-22 season, while Burns won three titles

Match 8: Kevin Kisner/Cameron Young (U.S.) tie Mito Pereira/Christiaan Bezuidenhout (INT)

- Match ends in a tie after neither team reached more than 1-up during the round
- Kisner, who owns a 22-7-1 record at the World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play, has yet to lose a match in two appearances at the Presidents Cup with a 2-0-3 record

Match 9: Patrick Cantlay/Xander Schauffele (U.S.) def. Hideki Matsuyama/Tom Kim (INT), 3 and 2

- Cantlay/Schauffele 3-and-2 victory comes one day after they defeated Adam Scott/Matsuyama, 6 and 5, in Foursomes
- After improving to 3-0-0 in Foursomes on Thursday, Cantlay/Schauffele notch the first Four-ball win of their Presidents Cup careers, moving to 1-2-0 each
- Cantlay/Schauffele have now played six times together in team format at the Presidents Cup, which is tied for second-most in event history (most: 7, Branden Grace/Louis Oosthuizen)
- Cantlay/Schauffele were 4-up through seven holes in each match, Thursday and Friday

Match 10: Billy Horschel/Max Homa (U.S.) def. Corey Connors/Taylor Pendrith (INT), 1-up

- Only match on Friday in which all four players are Presidents Cup rookies
- Pendrith made a 13-foot, 5-inch putt for birdie at No. 18 and Homa holed an 11-foot putt to tie the hole and win the match

- Homa is one of five players with a 2-0-0 record this year (all U.S.) and the only one that has won a match with two different partners; Homa played Foursomes in Round One with Tony Finau (def. Pendrith/Mito Pereira, 1-up)
- Homa successfully defended his title at last week's Fortinet Championship

Miscellaneous notes

All matches are worth one point, for a total of 30 points. There are no playoffs, with each side receiving a half point if a match is tied after 18 holes. In a change inspired by the events of the 2003 Presidents Cup, if the match is deadlocked at the end of Singles play, the competition will be deemed a tie and the teams will share the Presidents Cup.
