



## 2022 Presidents Cup: Round Four Results and Notes

### Things to Know

- The International Team earns three of four points in Saturday afternoon Four-ball to pull within four points, 11-7
- Tom Kim wins twice on Saturday and clinches his Four-ball match with a birdie on the 18<sup>th</sup> hole
- Cam Davis finishes eagle-birdie-birdie to secure a 1-up victory with Adam Scott
- Justin Thomas and Jordan Spieth become the third pairing to win 4 points in a single Presidents Cup
- Thomas becomes the first player in Presidents Cup history to reach 10 wins in first three Presidents Cup appearances
- Year-by-year scores after Round Four since the format for the third and final rounds changed to four points each in 2015:
  - 2015: U.S. 9½, INT 8½
  - 2017: U.S. 14½, INT 3½
  - 2019: INT 10, U.S. 8
  - 2022: U.S. 11, INT 7
- There have been two years in which a team has recorded 8 points or more in Singles: 1994 (U.S., 8) and 2019 (U.S., 8); the most points the International Team has recorded in Singles in one year is 7.5 (2013, 2017).

### Match 15: Si Woo Kim/Tom Kim (INT) def. Patrick Cantlay/Xander Schauffele (U.S.), 1-up

- Tom Kim birdies the par-4 18<sup>th</sup> hole from 10 feet to clinch a 1-up win with Si Woo Kim; both players earn their second full points of the week
- Kim/Kim were 1-up after the second hole and did not lead again until Kim's clinching putt at the 18<sup>th</sup> hole
- After sitting out Saturday morning Foursomes, Cantlay/Schauffele lose their first match of the week as partners (2-1-0) and drop to 1-3-0 in Four-ball
- Tom Kim holes an eagle putt on the par-4 11<sup>th</sup> hole from 54' 6" in round four after making eagle from 36' 3" in round three
- Kim is the third-youngest player to compete in the Presidents Cup at 20 years, 3 months, 1 day (Ryo Ishikawa, Jordan Spieth); Spieth (2-2-0, 2013) and Ishikawa (3-2-0, 2009) also earned at least two points in their debut appearance

### Match 16: Justin Thomas/Jordan Spieth (U.S.) def. Hideki Matsuyama/Taylor Pendrith (INT), 4 and 3

- Thomas/Spieth lost one hole (No. 1) en route to a 4-and-3 win for their fourth victory this week
- Third pairing to win 4 points in a single Presidents Cup, joining Tiger Woods/Steve Stricker (2009) and Louis Oosthuizen/Branden Grace (2015)
- Five players have finished with a 5-0-0 record at the Presidents Cup (Mark O'Meara, 1996; Shigeki Maruyama, 1998; Tiger Woods, 2009; Jim Furyk, 2011; Branden Grace, 2015); Spieth (0-3-0) and Thomas (0-2-0) have yet to win a Singles match at the Presidents Cup
- Of the 64 holes played this week, Thomas/Spieth have trailed for two holes
- With his fourth win this week, Thomas becomes the first player in Presidents Cup history to reach 10 wins in his first three Presidents Cup appearances

### Match 17: Sungjae Im/Sebastian Munoz (INT) def. Tony Finau/Kevin Kisner (U.S.), 3 and 2

- Im/Munoz never trailed in their match and each collected their first full point of the week; combined to birdie five of six holes from Nos. 11-16
- Im remains undefeated in Four-ball in his Presidents Cup career, improving to 3-0-1
- With Im's victory, all four South Koreans on the International Team have earned at least one point:
  - Sungjae Im: 1-2-1
  - Tom Kim: 2-2-0
  - Si Woo Kim: 2-1-0

- K.H. Lee: 1-1-0
- Munoz is the second Colombian to compete in the Presidents Cup, joining captain's assistant Camilo Villegas, who finished 0-4-0 in his lone appearance in 2009

**Match 18: Adam Scott/Cam Davis (INT) def. Billy Horschel/Sam Burns (U.S.), 1-up**

- Davis finishes eagle-birdie-birdie to help secure a 1-up victory with Adam Scott for his second point in his Presidents Cup debut
- After starting the week 0-2-0, Scott wins both matches on Saturday; owns 18 career match wins in the Presidents Cup
- 48<sup>th</sup> match played by Scott (second-most in Presidents Cup history; most: 55, Phil Mickelson)
- Burns remains winless through the first four rounds in his Presidents Cup debut

**Miscellaneous notes**

All matches are worth one point, for a total of 30 points. There are no playoffs, with each side receiving a half point if a match is tied after 18 holes. In a change inspired by the events of the 2003 Presidents Cup, if the match is deadlocked at the end of Singles play, the competition will be deemed a tie and the teams will share the Presidents Cup.
