Things to Know

- Carl Yuan leads the RBC Canadian Open by one stroke over four players including Corey Conners, the highest-ranked Canadian player in the FedExCup and the Official World Golf Ranking
- Conners (T2), one of 21 Canadians in the field, holds the highest 36-hole position by a Canadian at the RBC Canadian Open since Mike Weir led by one stroke in 2004
- Tyrrell Hatton (T2) ties the longest birdie streak of his TOUR career with five consecutive (Nos. 7-11)
- Two-time defending champion and World No. 3 Rory McIlroy, who leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting, cards a bogeyfree 5-under 67 and enters the third round T12
- Weir (T47) makes the cut for the 11th time in his 30th start at the event (first since 2014)
- The front nine played more than two strokes more difficult than the back nine for the second consecutive round

- Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win the RBC Canadian Open since 1983 (most recent: Scott Piercy/2012)
- 9 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win on TOUR in 2022-23 (most recent: Wyndham Clark/Wells Fargo Championship)

Carl Yuan (1st/-9)

- First career lead/co-lead after any round on TOUR (previous-best position: T5/R2/2022 Texas Children's Houston Open; finished T35)
- Career-best result on TOUR: T17/2019 WGC-HSBC Champions
- Finished No. 2 in the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Points List (was No. 1 at the end of the Regular Season); had one win (Chitimacha Louisiana Open) and three runner-up finishes on the Korn Ferry Tour in 2022

Corey Conners (T2/-8)

- T2 is the highest 36-hole position by a Canadian at the RBC Canadian Open since Mike Weir led by one stroke in 2004
- Has one top-10 in seven previous starts in the event (2022/6th) and five missed cuts; won the Rivermead Cup as the low Canadian professional in 2022
- Winner of the 2023 Valero Texas Open; one of three Canadian winners on TOUR this season, the most in a single season in TOUR history (others: Mackenzie Hughes/Sanderson Farms Championship, Adam Svensson/RSM Classic; Hughes and Svensson both MC)

- The last Canadian to win the RBC Canadian Open was Pat Fletcher in 1954 (not recognized as an official PGA TOUR win)
- One of 21 Canadians in the field; is the highest-ranked Canadian in the FedExCup (27) and Official World Golf Ranking (29)

Additional notes

- With a 3-under 69, 18-hole co-leader **Aaron Rai** (T2/-8) records a score in the 60s in the second round following a first-round lead/co-lead for the first time in three attempts this season (78/Farmers Insurance Open, 71/RBC Heritage)
- **Tyrrell Hatton** (T2/-8) records five consecutive birdies (Nos. 7-11), tying his career-long streak on TOUR (final five holes in the final round of the 2023 PLAYERS Championship), and ties his low round of the season with a 64 (R4/AT&T Byron Nelson); Hatton missed the cut in his tournament debut in 2022
- Two-time defending champion Rory McIlroy (T12/-6) leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (5.383 total) after a second-round 67; the last player to earn three consecutive wins at a tournament was Steve Stricker at the John Deere Classic (2009-11)

- Making his first start as a PGA TOUR member and as a professional, Ludvig Aberg (T32/-3) cards an even-par 72; the 23year-old Swede finished No. 1 in the 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking to become the first player to earn a PGA TOUR card via PGA TOUR University
- Eight-time PGA TOUR winner and 2024 Presidents Cup International Team Captain **Mike Weir** (T47) makes the cut for the 11th time in his 30th start at the event (first since 2014); Weir's most recent made cut on TOUR prior to this week was the 2021 Sony Open in Hawaii (T47)
- David Lingmerth (back) WD during the second round
- The front nine played more than two strokes more difficult than the back nine for the second consecutive round
