TOP STORYLINES

The RBC Heritage is the 26th event of the 2022-23 PGA TOUR Season and sixth designated event, featuring seven of the top 10 players in the Official World Golf Ranking (38 of top 50), 28 of the top 30 players in the FedExCup standings and 19 of the 20 players that have won on TOUR this season.

47 players in the 143 player field competed at last week's Masters Tournament, including 10 players who finished T10 or better, highlighted by winner Jon Rahm.

FedExCup leader and World No. 1 **Jon Rahm** won the Masters Tournament, earning his 11th career PGA TOUR victory and second major championship title. Rahm has won four times on TOUR this season and has earned \$13,288,540 in Official Money this season, the second-highest single-season total in TOUR history (highest: \$14,046,910, Scottie Scheffler, 2021-22). No player has won five times in a season on TOUR since Justin Thomas in 2016-17. With the victory, Rahm returned to No. 1 in the Official World Golf Ranking and ties Brooks Koepka for 10th-most weeks at No. 1 (47). This past week marked the fifth time the World No. 1 position has changed since the start of the 2022-23 season.

Rahm marks the first reigning Masters Tournament winner to play the following week on TOUR since Jordan Spieth in 2015 (Won/Masters Tournament, T11/RBC Heritage). Rahm won his first two victories of the season in back-to-back starts (Sentry Tournament of Champions, The American Express) and with a win at Harbour Town Golf Links, Rahm would become the first player to win consecutive tournaments including a major since Rory McIlroy in 2014 (WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, PGA Championship).

2022 RBC Heritage winner **Jordan Spieth** is making his seventh start at Harbour Town Golf Links. The 13-time PGA TOUR winner has played in 11 TOUR events to date as the defending champion and has never successfully defended a TOUR title (three top-fives in those 11 starts).

Title Defense Finish

Five players successfully defended a title during the 2021-22 season, the most since 2007 (5), while three have done so this season (Max Homa/Fortinet Championship, Rory McIlroy/THE CJ CUP in South Carolina, Scottie Scheffler/WM Phoenix Open). The last player to successfully defend title at the RBC Heritage was Boo Weekley in 2008.

ADDITIONAL STORYLINES

World No. 2 and reigning PGA TOUR Player of the Year **Scottie Scheffler** will be making his tournament debut. Scheffler has eight top-10s in 11 starts this season, including four as the defending champion in a nine-week stretch. Scheffler successfully defended his title during the first opportunity (WM Phoenix Open), then finished T4 at the Arnold Palmer Invitational and fourth at the World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play. He concluded his fourth title defense attempt with a T10 at last week's Masters Tournament.

Three PGA TOUR players ranked in the top 10 of the Official World Golf Ranking will be making their second start at RBC Heritage this week and first since the tournament was the second one played following the PGA TOUR's COVID-19 shutdown in 2020.

World No. 4 **Patrick Cantlay** has only finished outside the top 10 once in five starts at the RBC Heritage (T3/2017, T7/2018, T3/2019, MC/2021, P2/2022). Cantlay, the 2021 FedExCup Champion, fell to 2015 FedExCup Champion Jordan Spieth on the first extra hole (No. 18) of the 2022 RBC Heritage, marking the first playoff in the FedExCup era (est. 2007) between two FedExCup Champions. The last player to win a tournament a season after losing it in a playoff was Ryuji Imada at the 2008 AT&T Classic (Zach Johnson def. Imada in 2007).

19-time PGA TOUR winner **Ernie Els** is playing this week on sponsor exemption. Els won the Hoag Classic last month on PGA TOUR Champions and is making his first non-major start on TOUR since the 2020 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (MC).

11-time PGA TOUR winner **Justin Rose** is making his 400th career start on TOUR. Rose won the 2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, his first win on TOUR since 2019 (Farmers Insurance Open).
