Playoff result: Fitzpatrick defeats Spieth with a birdie-3 on the third playoff hole (No. 18) after matching pars on the first (No. 18) and second (par-3 17th) extra holes

Things to Know

- Reigning U.S. Open champion Matt Fitzpatrick defeats defending champion Jordan Spieth in a playoff to win the RBC Heritage, earning his second career PGA TOUR title
- Fitzpatrick is the third player from England to win on TOUR this season, tying the most in a single season on record (1983present)
- The playoff between Fitzpatrick and Spieth was the first on TOUR featuring multiple players that had previously won a major championship since the 2020 Sentry Tournament of Champions (Justin Thomas* def. Patrick Reed* and Xander Schauffele)
- Spieth becomes the first defending champion to lose in a playoff since Schauffele at the 2020 Sentry Tournament of Champions
- Spieth now has 18 runner-up finishes on TOUR since the start of the 2013 season, four more than any other player in that span

Matt Fitzpatrick (Winner/-17*)

- Defeats Jordan Spieth in a playoff to win the RBC Heritage, earning his second PGA TOUR title in his 122nd career start at the age of 28 years, 7 months, 15 days
- Third player from England to win on TOUR this season
 Most winners from England in a single season on record (1983-present)
 3, 2022-23 (Justin Rose, Matt Wallace, Matt Fitzpatrick)
 3, 2017-18 (Justin Rose, Paul Casey, Ian Poulter)
 3, 2010 (Ian Poulter, Justin Rose, Lee Westwood)
- Second player from England to win the RBC Heritage and first since Nick Faldo in 1984
- Second player from England to will the RBC Heritage and hist since Nick
- Moves from No. 81 to No. 22 in the FedExCup standings
- Moves from No. 16 to No. 8 in the Official World Golf Ranking, the highest position of his career

- 2-for-3 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (2019 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard/2nd, 2022 U.S. Open/Won, 2023 RBC Heritage/Won)
- Fifth 54-hole leader/co-leader to win the RBC Heritage since 2010 and first since Stewart Cink in 2021
- 14th 54-hole leader/co-leader to win on TOUR in 2022-23 and first since Scottie Scheffler at THE PLAYERS Championship
- Has won seven titles on the DP World Tour
- Won the 2022 U.S. Open at The Country Club, joining Jack Nicklaus as the second male golfer to win a U.S. Open and a U.S. Amateur title (2013) at the same venue
- Competing with his brother, Alex, at next week's Zurich Classic of New Orleans

Jordan Spieth (P2/-17)

- Becomes the first defending champion to lose in a playoff since Schauffele at the 2020 Sentry Tournament of Champions (defeated Patrick Cantlay in a playoff in 2022)
- 18 runner-up finishes on TOUR since the start of the 2013 season, four more than any other player in that span (second-most: 14, Dustin Johnson)
- Best result in 12 career title defenses on TOUR
- Falls to 5-4 in playoffs in PGA TOUR career

Miscellaneous notes

- Patrick Cantlay (3rd) and Xander Schauffele (4th) both finish in the top five and will defend their title at next week's Zurich Classic of New Orleans
- The top four players on the leaderboard all entered the week in the top 20 of the Official World Golf Ranking (16/Fitzpatrick, 15/Spieth, 4/Patrick Cantlay, 6/Xander Schauffele)
- Taylor Moore (T11) finishes the week with 99 putts, the fewest of any player
- World No. 2 Scottie Scheffler finishes T11, his 11th consecutive finish of T12 or better
- World No. 1 and FedExCup leader **Jon Rahm** finishes T15 (first player since Spieth in 2015 to play on TOUR the week after winning the Masters Tournament)
