TOP STORYLINES

Fresh off his maiden appearance at the Presidents Cup, four-time PGA TOUR winner Sam Burns returns to defend his 2021 Sanderson Farms Championship title. The former LSU All-American, who made his professional debut at the Sanderson Farms event in 2017 where he finished T43, captured three victories in 2021-22 (Sanderson Farms Championship, Valspar Championship, Charles Schwab Challenge).

With a total of 22-under par in 2021, Burns recorded the lowest 72-hole score since the tournament moved to The Country Club of Jackson in 2014. Burns has held the lead/co-lead after 17 rounds in individual stroke-play events since the start of the 2020-21 season, the most of any player.

Along with Burns, Christiaan Bezuidenhout of South Africa is one of two players in the field at the Sanderson Farms Championship that competed at last week's Presidents Cup at Quail Hollow. Bezuidenhout went 1-0-1 for the International Team and will make his tournament debut in Jackson, Mississippi.

Four of the last six FedExCup Champions have won a tournament in the fall portion of the season before going on to win the season-long race. Most recently, Rory McIlroy won THE CJ CUP last fall and went on to win the 2022 FedExCup. The other players to do so in the last six seasons are Justin Thomas (2016 CIMB Classic, 2017 FedExCup), Justin Rose (2017 WGC-HSBC Champions, 2018 FedExCup) and Patrick Cantlay (2020 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, 2021 FedExCup).

Six of the last eight Sanderson Farms Championship winners have been first-time PGA TOUR winners: Nick Taylor (2014), Peter Malnati (2015), Cody Gribble (2016), Ryan Armour (2017), Cameron Champ (2018), Sebastián Muñoz (2019).

Sahith Theegala, who finished T8 a year ago after holding the 54-hole lead at the Sanderson Farms Championship will make his third event start. Theegala completed a rookie campaign that included five top-10s, highlighted by a runner-up at the Travelers Championship and a trip to the TOUR Championship. Theegala seeks his first PGA TOUR victory in his 47th start after finishing T6 two weeks ago at the Fortinet Championship.

Chad Ramey hails from Fulton and graduated from Mississippi State in 2014. Ramey captured the Corales Puntacana Championship and was one of just two rookies to win on the PGA TOUR in 2021-22 (Tom Kim/Wyndham Championship).

Hattiesburg native Davis Riley attended the University of Alabama where he was a third-team All-America selection in 2018. Riley notched six top-10 finishes in his rookie campaign in 2021-22, including a playoff runner-up to Sam Burns at the Valspar Championship.

Hayden Buckley was born in Tennessee but grew up in Tupelo and attended the University of Missouri, where he was a thirdteam All-America and first team All-SEC in 2018. Buckley finished T4 as a rookie at the 2021 Sanderson Farms Championship and finished 92nd in the official FedExCup standings.

2021 runner-up Nick Watney held a share of the 36-hole lead/co-lead before earning his best result since a T2 at the 2018 Wells Fargo Championship. Watney qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs for the 13th time and first since 2019, finishing the 2021-22 season No. 108 in the official FedExCup standings.

2012 Sanderson Farms Championship winner Scott Stallings is one of seven past champions in the field and is set to make his eighth consecutive start at the event. Last season, Stallings advanced to the TOUR Championship for the first time in his 12th season on TOUR, finishing No. 27 in the official FedExCup standings.

J.T. Poston (No. 14) is set to make his seventh start at the Sanderson Farms Championship (best: 3rd/2020) and is one of five players who qualified for the 2022 TOUR Championship in the field (others: Sepp Straka/7th, Sam Burns/22nd, Sahith Theegala/26th, Scott Stallings/27th).

ADDITIONAL STORYLINES

Making his fifth start at the Sanderson Farms Championship, **Sepp Straka** seeks his first made cut at the Country Club of Jackson. With his first career victory at the 2022 Honda Classic, Straka became the first player from Austria to win on TOUR. Straka qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs for the fourth consecutive season and advanced to the TOUR Championship for the first time in 2021-22. Straka marks the second-highest ranked player in the field at No. 36 in the Official World Golf Ranking.

With a solo-third finish at the season-opening Fortinet Championship, PGA TOUR rookie **Taylor Montgomery** is the highest-ranked player in the field in the FedExCup standings. Montgomery enters the week with five-consecutive top-10 finishes in PGA TOUR-sanctioned play, having closed the season with four top-10 finishes on the Korn Ferry Tour to secure his PGA TOUR card.

Harris English was limited to 12 starts during the 2021-22 season after undergoing surgery to repair a torn labrum in his hip. In 2021, English won twice on TOUR, advanced to the TOUR Championship for the second consecutive season and competed in the Ryder Cup for the first time in his career. He missed nearly five months on TOUR last season between the Sony Open in Hawaii and the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday and failed to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs. English opened the 2022-23 season with a T9 at the Fortinet Championship, his first top-10 since the 2021 World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational (4th). The four-time PGA TOUR winner is making his fourth start at the Sanderson Farms Championship and first since 2019.

Sponsor exemptions **Sam Murphy** of Louisiana Tech and **Brice Wilkinson** of Southern Miss will be making their PGA TOUR debuts in Jackson, Mississippi. Wilkinson, a Madison, Mississippi native won the 108th Mississippi State Amateur in June. Ole Miss graduate **Jackson Suber** is set to make his first PGA TOUR start as a professional after missing the cut at the 2022 Valspar Championship as an amateur. Suber was a 2022 PGA TOUR University Second Team member and competed on PGA TOUR Canada over the summer.
