Miscellaneous Notes

- World No. 2 **Scottie Scheffler** (T2) birdies his final four holes to sit two back after matching 7-under 66s in the first two rounds; 409-yard drive on No. 12 marks the longest drive of his PGA TOUR career
- In his tournament debut, **J.J. Spaun** (T2) sits two shots back following a 5-under 68; in search of second career TOUR victory (2022 Valero Texas Open)
- 2016 Sentry Tournament of Champions winner **Jordan Spieth** (4) cards two eagles (Nos. 5 and 15) and trails by three heading into the weekend

- 2019 Sentry Tournament of Champions winner **Xander Schauffele** withdrew during the second round with a back injury
