Things to Know

- Jon Rahm picks up his eighth PGA TOUR victory in his 133rd start and wins for the seventh consecutive season
- Rahm becomes the first player to follow a runner-up finish with a victory the following season at the Sentry Tournament of Champions since Vijay Singh in 2007; the last to perform the feat on TOUR was Scottie Scheffler at the 2022 World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play
- After entering the day seven strokes back, Rahm equals the largest come-from-behind win at the Sentry Tournament of Champions (Gary Player/1978); is the largest come-from-behind win on TOUR since Sam Burns came from seven back to overtake Scottie Scheffler at the 2022 Charles Schwab Challenge
- Morikawa entered the day with a six-stroke lead, matching the largest lead lost with 18 holes to play on TOUR
- Morikawa falls to 1-for-3 when holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead; earns his sixth runner-up finish on TOUR
- Seamus Power finishes T25 and maintains lead in the FedExCup standings

Jon Rahm (Won/-27)

- Picks up his eighth PGA TOUR victory in his 133rd start at the age of 28 years, 1 month and 29 days
- Earns 550 points and moves to No. 4 in the FedExCup standings
- Final-round 63 is the lowest finish by a winner since Tom Kim's 61 to win the 2022 Wyndham Championship
- Becomes the first player to follow a runner-up finish with a victory the following season at the Sentry Tournament of Champions since Vijay Singh in 2007; the last to perform the feat on TOUR was Scottie Scheffler at the 2022 World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play
- Entered the day trailing Collin Morikawa by seven strokes, equaling the largest come-from-behind victory at the event (Gary Player/1978); is the largest come-from-behind win on TOUR since Sam Burns came from seven behind to overtake Scottie Scheffler at the 2022 Charles Schwab Challenge
- Shared the first-round lead following a 9-under 64; joins Tony Finau (Cadence Bank Houston Open) as the only first-round leaders/co-leaders to go on to win this season
- After Americans won the event 11 straight seasons from 2011-2021, becomes the second-consecutive international winner of the event (Cameron Smith/2022)
- Wins for the seventh consecutive season on the PGA TOUR
- Has six top-10 finishes in as many starts at the event, including runner-up finishes in 2018 and 2022

Collin Morikawa (2nd/-25)

- In search of his first win since the 2021 Open Championship, five-time TOUR winner posts 1-under 72 to finish runner-up for the sixth time; held at least a share of the lead following the first three rounds this week

- Entered the day with a six-stroke lead, matching the largest lead lost with 18 holes to play on TOUR
- Falls to 1-for-3 when holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead

Additional Players

- Making tournament debut, **Tom Hoge** (T3) records his fifth top-15 finish in seven starts this season
- **Scottie Scheffler** (T7) maintains No. 2 ranking in the Official World Golf Ranking after entering the week needing a two-way tie for third or better to return to World No. 1
- **Seamus Power** maintains lead in the FedExCup standings following T25 finish
- Making his season debut and first start since the 2022 BMW Championship, **Will Zalatoris** finishes T11
