### Second-Round Notes – Friday, October 7, 2022

Weather: Sunny. High of 91. Wind E 6-12 mph.

36-hole cut: 76 professionals and one amateur at 4-under 138 from a field of 143 professionals and one amateur; lowest cut since the 2022 Barbasol Championship (-5)

#### Things to Know

- Mito Pereira holds the first 36-hole lead/co-lead of his career and first lead after any round since round three of the 2022 PGA Championship
- All 10 members of the recent Presidents Cup teams who are in the field this week made the cut, including eight currently T17 or better; the group is led by International Team members Mito Pereira (1<sup>st</sup>), Tom Kim (T3) and Si Woo Kim (T3)
- First-round leader Tom Hoge falls to T17 following a second-round 1-over 72
- Defending champion Sungjae Im posts 1-under 70, his 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive under-par score at TPC Summerlin

#### Second-Round Lead Notes

- 9 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win the Shriners Children's Open since it became a 72-hole event in 2004 (Most recent: Sungjae Im/2022)
- 2 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win on TOUR in 2022-23 (Most recent: Mackenzie Hughes/Sanderson Farms Championship)

#### Mito Pereira (1<sup>st</sup>/-12)

- First 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; only other lead after a round came at the 2022 PGA Championship, where he held a 3-shot lead heading into the final round over Matt Fitzpatrick and Will Zalatoris before a 5-over 75 led to a T3 finish
- Cards his best opening 36-hole score on TOUR; previous-best was 132 after rounds of 68-64 at the 2022 PGA Championship
- Nine birdies in round two is a career-high on the PGA TOUR; has had three rounds with eight birdies, most recently in the final round of the 2022 AT&T Byron Nelson
- Leads a group of six members from the International Team from the Presidents Cup currently ranked T17 or better: Pereira (1<sup>st</sup>), Tom Kim (T3), Si Woo Kim (T3), Cam Davis (T6), Christiaan Bezuidenhout (T17), Sungjae Im (T17)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (7.971), Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (6.393), Proximity (28'6")
- Best finishes in 36 PGA TOUR starts came at the 2021 Fortinet Championship (3<sup>rd</sup>) and 2022 PGA Championship (T3)

#### Miscellaneous notes

- **Robby Shelton** (2<sup>nd</sup>/-11) posts bogey-free 8-under 63, one shy of his career-low round on TOUR (R1/2019 Military Tribute at The Greenbrier)
- The featured grouping of **Si Woo Kim** (T3/-10), **Tom Kim** (T3/-10) and **Max Homa** (T9/-8) combine to shoot 28-under through the first two rounds
- Las Vegas resident **Maverick McNealy** (T3/-10) trails by two strokes as he seeks his first PGA TOUR win in his 95<sup>th</sup> start; leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (7.171)
- **Cam Davis** (T6/-9) sets the best birdie-eagle streak of the season by playing Nos. 13-17 in 6-under (birdie-birdie-eagle-birdie-birdie) en route to a second-round 5-under 66 (previous-best: 4-under/Sepp Straka/Sanderson Farms Championship/R1); his previous-best birdie-eagle streak was 5-under (birdie-birdie-birdie-eagle) on Nos. 11-14 at the 2020 Workday Charity Open (Muirfield Village Golf Club); is a combined 10-under on Nos. 13-17 this week, having gone birdie-birdie-birdie-par on Thursday
- Defending champion **Sungjae Im** (T17/-7) posts second-round 1-under 70, his 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive under-par score at TPC Summerlin; the only player to successfully defend a title at the Shriners Children's Open is Jim Furyk (1999)
- **Gary Woodland** withdraws during the second round with a back injury
