Things to Know

- Patrick Cantlay and Tom Kim, two of the four highest-ranked players in the field entering the week, share the lead entering the final round of the Shriners Children's Open
- Cantlay misses a 24-foot, 2-inch birdie putt at No. 18 and shoots 60, tying his career-low on the PGA TOUR and the TPC Summerlin course record; would have been the 13th sub-60 score in PGA TOUR history
- With a win Sunday, Kim would become the first player since Tiger Woods to win twice on the PGA TOUR before turning 21
- Kim has made par or birdie on all 54 holes; last player to play 72 holes without a bogey or worse on TOUR: Joaquin Niemann, 2021 Rocket Mortgage Classic

Third-Round Lead Notes

- 10 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win the Shriners Children's Open since it became a 72-hole event in 2004 (Most recent: Martin Laird/2020)
- 0 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win on TOUR in 2022-23

Patrick Cantlay (T1/-19)

- Cards an 11-under 60, tying his career-low score on the PGA TOUR and the TPC Summerlin course record
- Second career 60 on TOUR; the first came as an amateur at the 2011 Travelers Championship (R2)
- Third 60 at TPC Summerlin during the Shriners Children's Open (others: J.J. Henry/R1/2013, Rod Pampling/R1/2016)
- Last 60 or better on TOUR before Cantlay: Justin Rose, 2022 RBC Canadian Open (60/R4)
- Ties career-high with 11 birdies (R4/2021 American Express)
- Ties career-low nine-hole score with a front-nine 29 (fifth instance; first since the first round of the 2022 American Express)
- Fifth 54-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR and second at the Shriners Children's Open (shot a final-round 73 in 2020 and finished T8); 3-for-3 at other tournaments (2021 BMW Championship, 2021 TOUR Championship, 2022 BMW Championship)
- One win (2017), two-runner-up finishes (2018, 2019) and a T8 (2020) in four prior starts at the event
- Leading money earner in tournament history (\$2,933,750)
- All three players in Cantlay's group shot 64 or better in the third round (Matthew NeSmith/63, S.H. Kim/64)

Tom Kim (T1/-19)

- With a win Sunday, would become the first player since Tiger Woods to win twice on the PGA TOUR before turning 21
- Earned his first PGA TOUR victory at the 2022 Wyndham Championship, becoming the first player born in the 2000s to win on TOUR
- Woods' first two wins: 1996 Shriners Children's Open, 1996 Walt Disney World/Oldsmobile Classic
- Second score of 62 or better in 65 career rounds on TOUR (first: 61, R4/2022 Wyndham Championship)
- Has made par or birdie on all 54 holes; last player to play 72 holes without a bogey or worse on TOUR: Joaquin Niemann, 2021 Rocket Mortgage Classic (last to do so en route to victory: J.T. Poston, 2019 Wyndham Championship)

Sungjae Im (T5/-15)

- Cards a 63, his fourth score of 63 or better in his last 10 rounds at the event (63/R2/2020, 63/R1/2021, 62/R4/2021, 63/R3/2022)
- Last player to successfully defend a title at the Shriners Children's Open: Jim Furyk (1999)
- Would become the second player to successfully defend a title on the season (first: Max Homa, Fortinet Championship)

Miscellaneous notes

- 54-hole co-leaders Patrick Cantlay and Tom Kim played two matches against each other at the recent Presidents Cup
 - Friday Four-ball: Patrick Cantlay/Xander Schauffele (U.S.) def. Hideki Matsuyama/Tom Kim (INT), 3 and 2
 - Saturday Four-ball: Si Woo Kim/Tom Kim (INT) def. Patrick Cantlay/Xander Schauffele (U.S.), 1-up
- Four of the top six players on the leaderboard competed at the recent Presidents Cup (Patrick Cantlay for the United States and Tom Kim, Mito Pereira and Sungjae Im for the International Team)
- **Adam Hadwin** (T7/-14) makes a hole-in-one at the par-3 14th (151 yards), his second career ace on the PGA TOUR (first came at the 2022 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday); last hole-in-one at No. 14 at TPC Summerlin: Chris Stroud, 2018
- **Matthew NeSmith** (T3/-16) has made three prior starts at the Shriners Children's Open and finished in the top 20 all three times, highlighted by a T8 in 2020; NeSmith has carded a score in the 60s in all 15 of his rounds played at TPC Summerlin
- 36-hole leader **Mito Pereira** cards a 4-under 67 and enters the final round T3 at 16-under
