54-hole lead notes

- Three players tied for the lead is tied for the most on the PGA TOUR this season (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- Records to date with the 54-hole lead/co-lead
 - Tom Kim: 1-for-1 (2022 Shriners Children's Open)
 - Adam Hadwin: 1-for-2 (2nd/2017 American Express, Won/2017 Valspar Championship)
 - Lanto Griffin: 1-for-1 (2019 Texas Children's Houston Open)
- Kim is the first player to hold the 54-hole lead/co-lead at the same event in consecutive years since Patrick Cantlay at the BMW Championship in 2021 and 2022 (won both)
- Kim is the first defending champion to hold the 54-hole lead/co-lead since Scottie Scheffler at the 2023 WM Phoenix Open (won)
- 17 players are tied for or within three strokes of the lead, the second-most of any tournament on TOUR this season through 54 holes (22, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)

Defending champion Tom Kim (T1/-15)

- 9-under 62 matches his third-round score en route to victory in 2022
- Third score of 62 or better this season (tied with Xander Schauffele for the most on TOUR); others: 62/R3/2022 Shriners Children's Open, 62/R2/The American Express
- Last player to successfully defend a title: Scheffler, 2023 WM Phoenix Open
- First career title defense on TOUR (DNP/2023 Wyndham Championship)
- Qualified for the 2023 TOUR Championship (first appearance in his career), finishing No. 20 in the FedExCup standings

Adam Hadwin (T1/-15)

- Seeks second career PGA TOUR win in his 245th start (2017 Valspar Championship)
- Four top-10s in seven prior starts at the Shriners Children's Open, including three in the last four years (T10/2014, T4/2019, T6/2021, T10/2022)
- One of two players with three top-10s in the last four years at the Shriners Children's Open (other: Patrick Cantlay)
- Qualified for the 2023 BMW Championship, finishing No. 45 in the FedExCup standings

Lanto Griffin (T1/-15)

- Seeks second career PGA TOUR win in 123rd start (2019 Texas Children's Houston Open)
- 198 is his lowest opening 54-hole score on the PGA TOUR (previous: 199 at the 2019 Shriners Children's Open and 2020 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP)
- Making fifth start at the Shriners Children's Open (best: T6/2021)
- Limited to 15 starts this season due to injuries to his lower back and rib (best result: T15/Valero Texas Open)
- Entering the week No. 188 in the FedExCup Fall standings and is projected to move to No. 80

FedExCup Fall Notes

- The top 125 in the FedExCup Fall standings thru The RSM Classic will be exempt into all Full-Field events and THE PLAYERS Championship next season
- Nos. 51-60 in the standings at the conclusion of The RSM Classic will qualify for two Signature Events in 2024 via The Next 10 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, The Genesis Invitational)
- Players currently projected to move into Top 125: Lanto Griffin (No. 188 to No. 80) and Chesson Hadley (No. 127 to No. 124)
- Players currently projected to move into The Next 10: Luke List (No. 61 to No. 58) and Sam Ryder (No. 63 to No. 60)

Additional Player Notes

- K.H. Lee (T4) seeks to become the third different player from South Korea to win the event in three years
- **Callum Tarren** (62) and Open Qualifier **Isaiah Salinda** (63) combined for a 17-under total while playing together in the third round; Tarren and Salinda enter the final round in a tie for seventh (-13)
- Tarren (double bogey at No. 17) became the fourth player this season to record a 62 or better with at least one double bogey or worse on his scorecard (first since Sepp Straka in the final round of the John Deere Classic)
- Joel Dahmen (T11/-12) recorded eagles at the par-4 12th and 15th, his first career round on TOUR with multiple eagles; Dahmen became the first player with multiple eagles on par 4s in the same round since Dylan Frittelli and Shane Lowry in the third round of the 2022 Open Championship
