Things to Know

- Starting the day three strokes back, **Si Woo Kim** shoots 6-under 64 to post 18-under and a one-stroke victory over 54-hole leader **Hayden Buckley**
- Moments after Buckley made a 16-footer for birdie on No. 16 for a one-stroke lead, Kim chipped in for birdie on the 17th hole to tie; Kim birdied the par-5 18th for the clubhouse lead; Buckley missed a 11' 9" putt on No. 18 for a chance to force a playoff
- Two-time Sony Open in Hawaii runner-up (2014, 2021) **Chris Kirk** finished third at 15-under, his best result of the season

- Earns fourth PGA TOUR win in 220th career start at 27 years, 6 months, and 18 days; marks first win since the 2021 American Express
- Becomes fourth consecutive winner of the Sony Open in Hawaii to come from behind in the final round, joining Hideki Matsuyama (2022), Kevin Na (2021) and Cameron Smith (2020)
- Earns second come-from-behind win in the final round (2017 PLAYERS Championship)
- Matches second-lowest final-round score on the PGA TOUR (lowest: 63/2016 Barbasol Championship)
- Matches second-lowest 72-hole score on the PGA TOUR (lowest: 259/2016 Wyndham Championship)
- Led the field in birdies (24)
- Becomes the first Korean player since K.J. Choi (2008) to win the Sony Open in Hawaii
- Earns 500 FedExCup Points to move from No. 84 to No. 8 in the FedExCup standings
- Becomes fully exempt on the PGA TOUR through the end of the 2025 season; earns a spot in the 2024 Sentry Tournament of Champions

Miscellaneous Notes

- Seeking first TOUR win, 54-hole leader **Hayden Buckley** finishes runner-up for his best result on TOUR (previous: T4/2021 Sanderson Farms Championship)
- 36-hole leader **Chris Kirk** (3rd) earns best finish on the PGA TOUR since the 2021 Sony Open in Hawaii (T2); marks third top-three finish at the event (2nd/2014, T2/2021, 3rd/2023)

- 2019 Sony Open in Hawaii runner-up **Andrew Putnam** (T4) earns second top-five of the season (T2/2022 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP)
- **David Lipsky** (T4) matches best finish on the PGA TOUR (T4/2022 Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Aaron Rai)
- **Ben Taylor** (T4) earns second top-five finish in last three starts (3rd/2022 Cadence Bank Houston Open)
- 2019 Sony Open in Hawaii champion **Matt Kuchar** (T7) notches his eighth top-15 in last 10 starts at the event
- **Brian Harman** (T32) closed with 5-under 65 to extend his TOUR-leading consecutive rounds of par or better to 31
- **Brice Garnett** (T21) and **Chad Ramey** (T54) matched Kim for the round of the day (64)
