Things to Know

- Seeking his first career PGA TOUR title, Davis Thompson records five eagles through two rounds, tying the most eagles made in a 72-hole event on record (1983-present)
- Thompson, a PGA TOUR rookie, holds first 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR
- 2018 American Express champion Jon Rahm sits solo-second in bid to become the event's 10th multiple winner
- 2022 Shriners Children's Open winner Tom Kim (T3) seeks to becomes the first multiple winner on TOUR this season
- World No. 2 Scottie Scheffler (T9) is the only player bogey-free through 36 holes

- First-round leader followed opening-round 10-under 62 (LQ) with an 8-under 64 at the Nicklaus Tournament Course
- Made a career-best three eagles (Nos. 4, 7, 11) in the second round, becoming the second player with three or more eagles in a round on TOUR this season (Kevin Yu/3/R1/Butterfield Bermuda Championship)
- With two eagles in the opening round and three in round two, matched the most eagles made in a 72-hole event on record (1983-present)

- Becomes the second player to have at least five eagles through 36-holes at The American Express (5/Scott McCarron/1995/MC)
- Seeks his first career PGA TOUR title in his 20th start; best career PGA TOUR finish: T9/2022 Fortinet Championship
- Holds first 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; previous-best position: T6/2021 Rocket Mortgage Classic/T58
- Would become the first player since Adam Long in 2019 to pick up his first PGA TOUR victory at The American Express
- Last rookie winner on TOUR: Tom Kim/2022 Wyndham Championship
- After winning the Korn Ferry Tour's REX Hospital Open in Georgia on his 23rd birthday (June 5, 2022), went on to earn his rookie card for the PGA TOUR
- In addition to competing on the 2021 U.S. Walker Cup team, was the No. 1 ranked player in the first PGA TOUR University rankings, which ultimately resulted in him automatically advancing to the final stage of the 2021 Korn Ferry Tour qualifying tournament

Miscellaneous Notes

- 2018 American Express champion **Jon Rahm** (2nd/-16) is making his first start since winning the Sentry Tournament of Champions; the last player to win in back-to-back starts on TOUR is Rory McIlroy (2022 TOUR Championship, 2022 CJ CUP in South Carolina); holds the TOUR's longest active made-cuts streak (20) with his last missed cut coming at the 2021 Fortinet Championship
- After finishing T21 at last week's Sony Open in Hawaii, **J.T. Poston** (T3/-13) moved into the top 50 of the Official World Golf Ranking for the first time in his career (No. 50); making his seventh start at The American Express and has one top-10 (T7/2019).
- In his bid for a fourth consecutive top-10 finish in his fifth start at The American Express, **Patrick Cantlay** sits T14 at 10-under 134
