



# 2023 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (33<sup>rd</sup> of 44 events in the 2022-23 PGA TOUR Regular Season)

### Things to Know

- 36-hole leader Justin Suh seeks first TOUR title in 49<sup>th</sup> start; made professional debut at this event in 2019 (MC)
- Hideki Matsuyama posts the low round of the week (65) and the only bogey-free round this week
- David Lipsky posts two rounds in the 60s, the only player to do so through 36 holes
- Patrick Cantlay is the highest-ranked player in the FedExCup standings (No. 6) without a win on TOUR this season
- World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler makes the cut on the number and sits 11 strokes off the lead
- First-round leader Davis Riley falls to T44 following a 6-over 78
- Defending champion Billy Horschel follows first-round 84 with even-par 72 and misses the cut

### Justin Suh (1<sup>st</sup>/-8)

- Reached 8-under with back-to-back birdies at Nos. 14 and 15 to take the outright lead; made his only bogey of the day at No. 16, before closing with a final-hole birdie to lead by one stroke in search of his first PGA TOUR victory
  - Marks third 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (2021 Corales Puntacana Championship/T28, 2023 Honda Classic/T5)
- No. 1 player on the Korn Ferry Tour last year leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting this week (+7.335), his best putting performance through 36 holes (previous best: +6.27/2023 Honda Classic)
- Seeks fourth career top-10 and third this season (T8/2020 Shriners Children's Open, T5/2023 Honda Classic, T6/2023 PLAYERS Championship)
- Lone prior appearance at this event marked his professional debut in 2019 (MC) following two TOUR starts as an amateur (2016 U.S. Open, 2019 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)

# Hideki Matsuyama (2<sup>nd</sup>/-7)

• Posts bogey-free 65 (-7) to match his low round this season (R4/Fortinet Championship, R3/Sony Open in Hawaii) and one stroke shy of his best at Muirfield Village (64//R1/2015, 64/R3/2019)

- Bogey-free round marks 67<sup>th</sup> of his career on TOUR, his third at this event and the only bogey-free round by any player through 36 holes
- First of eight PGA TOUR titles came at this event in 2014 during his tournament debut; most recent TOUR victory was 2022 Sony Open in Hawaii; eight-time winner on Japan Golf Tour, most recently claiming two titles in 2016
- Owns two additional top-10s at this event, along with his win in 2014 (T5/2015, 6<sup>th</sup>/2019); was disqualified last year for using a non-conforming club in the opening round
- Two top-10 finishes this season on TOUR (T9/Farmers Insurance Open, 5<sup>th</sup>/THE PLAYERS Championship)
- Since suffering a neck injury at the 2022 Arnold Palmer Invitational, withdrew during a tournament three times in 2022 (Valero Texas Open, 3M Open, Texas Children's Houston Open)

# **Miscellaneous notes**

- David Lipsky (T3/-6) is the only player with two rounds in the 60s; had not broken 70 in either of two previous appearances at this event (T48/2019, T37/2022)
- Two-time champion **Patrick Cantlay** (T3/-6) seeks to join Kenny Perry (3) and Tiger Woods (5) as the only players with three or more victories at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday; at No. 6 in the FedExCup standings, is the highest-ranked player without a win on TOUR this season
- In eight starts at this event, Si Woo Kim (T5/-5) has now posted seven sub-par second-round scores (73/+1/2020)
- Mark Hubbard (T5/-5) has improved his result in each of his three previous starts at the event (MC/2016, 72<sup>nd</sup>/2020, T42/2021)
- In his 230<sup>th</sup> start, Rory McIlroy (T7/-4) makes his 200<sup>th</sup> cut on TOUR (87.0 %); has made 10 cuts in 12 appearances at the Memorial Tournament; T4 in 2016 marks best result at Muirfield Village
- Sepp Straka (T7/-4) posts his first sub-70 score in his 12<sup>th</sup> round at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
- Patrick Rodgers (T7/-4) notches 12 birdies through 36 holes, most of any player in the field
- 2020 Memorial Tournament champion and FedExCup leader **Jon Rahm** (T7/-4) begins round two with back-to-back bogeys, before adding four birdies en route to a second consecutive round of 2-under 70
- **Rickie Fowler** (T7/-4) owns two runner-up results in 13 previous starts at Muirfield Village, including his tournament debut in 2010 (2<sup>nd</sup>/2010, T2/2017)
- Xander Schauffele (T22/-1) bounces back with 66 after a first-round 77 to make the cut, extending his streak to 26 (longest active on TOUR); last missed cut was 2022 Masters Tournament (WD after the first round of the no-cut 2023 Sentry Tournament of Champions); since missing the cut in his tournament debut (2018), has not finished worse than T18 in his last four starts at the event (T14/2019, T13/2020, T11/2021, T18/2022)
- Current U.S. Amateur champion Sam Bennett (T34/E) makes the cut in his professional debut
- Making his first start on TOUR since the 2022 Fortinet Championship, **Brandt Snedeker** (T44/+1) makes the cut for the second year in a row at this event after failing to advance to the weekend in his first six appearances
- World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler (T61/+3) sits 11 strokes behind the leader; largest comeback after 36 holes in tournament history: 9 strokes/Raymond Floyd/1982
- Defending champion **Billy Horschel** (MC/+12) follows opening-round 84 with an even-par 72 that included a triple-bogey 8 at No. 5
- Brendon Todd withdrew during the second round with a shoulder injury
