Things to Know

- World No. 3 Rory McIlroy, bidding for his 24th career PGA TOUR win and second win of the 2022-23 season (THE CJ CUP in South Carolina) makes 8-foot, 9-inch putt to save par on No. 18 and earn a share of the 54-hole lead
- Four-time PGA TOUR winner Si Woo Kim (T1), who joins McIlroy in Sunday's final pairing, seeks his second win of the 2022-23 season (Sony Open in Hawaii) and his first multi-win season on TOUR
- Both players in Sunday's final pairing (McIlroy, Kim) have won on TOUR this season and are previous winners of THE PLAYERS Championship (2019/McIlroy, 2017/Kim)
- At No. 160 in the Official World Golf Ranking, David Lipsky could become the first player from outside the top 50 to win the Memorial Tournament since 2017 (No. 65 Jason Dufner)
- Five of the 13 players standing T9 or higher are seeking their first PGA TOUR win David Lipsky (T1), Denny McCarthy (T4), Lee Hodges (T4), Mark Hubbard (T4), Patrick Rodgers (T9)
- There are 22 players within three strokes of the lead; largest 54-hole deficit overcome on TOUR this season is seven strokes (Jon Rahm/Sentry Tournament of Champions)
- 36-hole leader Justin Suh falls to T14 and three strokes off the lead after third-round 77, his highest score since a final-round 78 earlier this season at The RBC Heritage

- 23 Third-round leaders/co-leaders at the Memorial Tournament who went on to win (most recent: Billy Horschel/2022)
- 17 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win on TOUR in 2022-23 (most recent: Brooks Koepka/PGA Championship)

Comparing co-leaders (entering the week)

Rory McIlroy (T1/-6)

- 19th career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (11-for-18 to date converting to victory)
- Second 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR this season (Won/THE CJ CUP in South Carolina)
- With a victory, would become the fifth player with multiple titles on TOUR this season (Jon Rahm/4, Tony Finau/2, Max Homa/2, Scottie Scheffler/2)

- No. 28 on the all-time PGA TOUR wins list with 23; would move into a tie for 26th with Dustin Johnson and Gary Player with a victory
- No. 3 in the Official World Golf Ranking; cannot reach No. 2 regardless of result
- In his 230th start, made cut this week for his 200th made cut on TOUR (87 percent)

Si Woo Kim (T1/-6)

- Countered double bogeys at Nos. 3 and 11, along with a bogey at the par-3 eighth hole with six birdies for 1-under 71
- Seeking a fifth career PGA TOUR win, his second win of the 2022-23 season (Sony Open in Hawaii) and his first multi-win season on TOUR
- With a victory, would become the fifth player with multiple titles on TOUR this season (Jon Rahm/4, Tony Finau/2, Max Homa/2, Scottie Scheffler/2)
- Holds his fifth 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; converted leads/co-leads into wins at 2016 Wyndham Championship, 2021 American Express
- Four top-10s in 20 starts this season include a win at the Sony Open in Hawaii and a T2 at the AT&T Byron Nelson
- Made the cut in all eight appearances at the Memorial Tournament; has one top-10 in previous seven appearances but top-25s in each of his last three (T13/2022, T9/2021, T18/2020)

David Lipsky (T1/-6)

- Makes four birdies against four bogeys, including three bogeys in his final six holes (Nos. 13, 17, 18) for even-par 72 after entering the day as the only player with two rounds in the 60s this week
- Holds first 54-hole lead/co-lead in 69th career start on TOUR
- Seeking first PGA TOUR win; has two DP World Tour victories (2018 Alfred Dunhill Championship, 2014 Omega European Masters), one Korn Ferry Tour win (2020 TPC San Antonio Challenge at the Canyons), and one Asian Tour win (2012 Handa Faldo Cambodian Classic)
- At No. 160 in the Official World Golf Ranking, could become the first player from outside the top 150 to win the event since 2015 (No. 212 David Lingmerth)
- Has two top-10s in 21 starts this season, highlighted by a T4 at Sony Open in Hawaii, his highest finish on TOUR in an individual stroke-play event
- Previous finishes in two starts at the Memorial Tournament: T48/2019 and T37/2022

Miscellaneous Notes

- Viktor Hovland (T4/-5) makes three consecutive birdies (Nos. 15-17) en route to 3-under 69, his second round in the 60s (66/2020/R2) in 15 career rounds at the Memorial Tournament; seeking fourth PGA TOUR win and first since 2021 World Wide Technology Championship; best finish in three previous starts at the Memorial Tournament was T47/2021
- Mark Hubbard (T4/-5) seeks his first PGA TOUR win in his 186th career start on TOUR (best finish: T2/2019 Texas Children's Houston Open); has improved his result in each of his three previous starts at the event (MC/2016, 72nd/2020, T42/2021)
- Wyndham Clark (T4/-5) cards 2-under 70 for third consecutive under-par round this week in bid for second PGA TOUR win of season and career (Wells Fargo Championship); he entered the week with one under-par round in eight career rounds (three starts) at the Memorial Tournament; finished T37 at 2022 Memorial Tournament after missed cuts in 2020 and 2021
- Denny McCarthy (T4/-5) eagles par-5 seventh and 15th with putts of 3 feet, 3 inches and 23 feet, 7 inches, respectively, to record multiple eagles in a round on TOUR for the second time in 494 career rounds (2021 Wyndham Championship/R1); finished T5 at the 2022 Memorial Tournament for one of five top-five finishes of TOUR career (most recent: T4/2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- After making the cut on the number, **Keegan Bradley** (T9/-4) cards 7-under 65 and ties the low round of the tournament this week (Hideki Matsuyama/R2) and his lowest round in 41 career rounds at the Memorial Tournament (2015/R3); marks his lowest round on TOUR since 2023 RBC Heritage (64/R3)
- 13-time PGA TOUR winner Jordan Spieth (T14/-3) hits all 14 fairways Saturday, marking second time in 878 career rounds on TOUR he hit every fairway in a round (2013 Texas Children's Houston Open/R2/hit 14 of 14 fairways)
- 2020 Memorial Tournament champion and FedExCup leader **Jon Rahm** (T23/-2) shoots 2-over 74, his third round of 74 or worse in 16 career rounds at the event (75/2020/R4; 77/2017/R2); he leads the field in Strokes Gained: Approach The Green (+6.242)
- World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler (T32/-1) posts 4-under 68 for third round in 60s in 11 career rounds at the Memorial Tournament (67/R1/2021; 69/R3/2021), leads the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (+11.244) and is 66th out of 66 players in Strokes Gained: Putting (-7.052)
- Making professional debut, current U.S. Amateur champion Sam Bennett (T42/E) remains even par after third-round 72
