Playoff: Hovland def. McCarthy with a par-4 on the first extra hole (No. 18)

Things to Know

- Viktor Hovland defeats Denny McCarthy in a playoff to win the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, earning his fourth career PGA TOUR title
- Hovland has won on the PGA TOUR in each of the last four seasons (only other players to do so are Rory McIlroy and Jon Rahm)
- Runner-up Denny McCarthy earns the best finish of his PGA TOUR career, moving inside the top 30 in the FedExCup standings (No. 26) and the top 50 in the Official World Golf Ranking (career-high No. 35)
- World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler cards a 5-under 67, three strokes better than any other player in the final round, to finish solothird
- Scheffler's Strokes Gained: Tee to Green total of 20.692 is the second-highest mark in a 72-hole event in the ShotLink era behind only Vijay Singh at the 2004 Deutsche Bank Championship (21.140)
- 54-hole co-leader Rory McIlroy (T7) cards a 3-over 75, his highest final-round score on TOUR since the 2022 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard
- Andrew Putnam (T5), Adam Schenk (T7) and Lee Hodges (T12) qualify for the 2023 Open Championship as the top-three finishers at the Memorial Tournament not otherwise exempt

Playoff notes

- First career playoff on the PGA TOUR for both Hovland and McCarthy
- 10th playoff in tournament history and first since 2021 (Patrick Cantlay def. Collin Morikawa)
- Fifth playoff on TOUR this season and second consecutive (Emiliano Grillo def. Adam Schenk at last week's Charles Schwab Challenge)
- First instance of playoffs in back-to-back weeks on the PGA TOUR schedule since the 2022 PGA Championship and Charles Schwab Challenge

- One of three players to win on the PGA TOUR in each of the last four seasons, joining Rory McIlroy and Jon Rahm
- Moves from No. 14 to No. 4 in the FedExCup standings
- Moves from No. 7 to No. No. 5 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- 281 is the highest 72-hole total by a TOUR winner since Scottie Scheffler at the 2022 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard (283)
- 7-under is the highest 72-hole total relative to par by a TOUR winner since Xander Schauffele at the 2022 Genesis Scottish Open (-7)
- With scores of 71-71-69-70, is the first player to record four scores of 69 or higher and go on to win since Phil Mickelson at the 2021 PGA Championship and the first outside of a major since Brandt Snedeker at the 2016 Farmers Insurance Open
- Only player in the field with four under-par scores

Denny McCarthy (P2/-7)

- Best finish of his PGA TOUR career (previous: T3/2021 Honda Classic)
- Moves from No. 47 to No. 26 in the FedExCup standings
- Moves from No. 55 to No. 35 in the Official World Golf Ranking, moving inside the top 50 for the first time in his career

Scottie Scheffler (3rd/-6)

- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee, SG: Tee to Green, SG: Approach the Green and SG: Around the Green; finished 65th of 65 players that completed 72 holes in SG: Putting
- Strokes Gained: Tee to Green total of 20.692 is the second-highest mark in a 72-hole event in the ShotLink era behind only Vijay Singh at the 2004 Deutsche Bank Championship (21.140)
- TOUR-best 12th top-10 of the season
- 15th consecutive result of T12 or better on TOUR
- Official Money total for the 2022-23 season is now \$16,293,295 (most in PGA TOUR history)

Miscellaneous Notes

- 54-hole co-leader **Rory McIlroy** (T7/-3) cards a 3-over 75, his highest final-round score on TOUR since the 2022 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard; McIlroy is the two-time defending champion at next week's RBC Canadian Open (2019, 2022)
- Other 54-hole co-leaders results: **Si Woo Kim**/4th, **David Lipsky**/T12; 36-hole leader **Justin Suh** finishes T41 and 18-hole leader **Davis Riley** finishes T54
- By finishing as the top-three players not already exempt, Andrew Putnam (T5/-4), Adam Schenk (T7/-3), and Lee
 Hodges (T12/-1) earn berths for The 151st Open Championship at Royal Liverpool via The Open Qualifying Series; Putnam
 has made one appearance at The Open (T32/2019), while Hodges and Schenk are in line to make their Open Championship
 debuts
- Making his first start on TOUR since the 2022 Fortinet Championship, Brandt Snedeker (T41/+4) records his highest finish in eight career appearances at the Memorial Tournament
- Current U.S. Amateur champion Sam Bennett finishes solo-63rd (+12) in his professional debut
- 2021 runner-up **Collin Morikawa** WD before the final round due to back spasms; Morikawa was T9 and two strokes back of the lead after 54 holes
- Matt Kuchar (62nd) finishes with 99 putts, tying the fewest in four rounds in tournament history (Max Homa, 2022)
- Final-round scoring average of 74.985 is the highest in a single round at the Memorial Tournament since the final round in 2020 (75.959) and the highest in any round on TOUR since the final round of the 2022 Arnold Palmer Invitational (75.481)
