Brian Harman (1st/-12)

- Leads by five strokes, the 12th instance in the last 40 years of a 54-hole lead of five strokes or more in a major championship; the leader successfully converted to victory nine times in the previous 11 attempts

- Fourth career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (1-for-3 to date) and second in a major (2017 U.S. Open/finished T2)
- 29 top-10s on the PGA TOUR since the start of the 2017-18 season, the most of any player without a win in that span (Tommy Fleetwood, currently T4, is second with 26); Harman has won twice on TOUR in his career: 2014 John Deere Classic, 2017 Wells Fargo Championship
- Finished T6 at The Open in 2022, his first top-10 in seven starts at the event; made tournament debut at Royal Liverpool in 2014 (T26)

Jon Rahm (3rd/-6)

- Career-low score in a major (63); previous: 64, 2021 Open Championship (R2)
- 14th score of 63 or better in the history of The Open Championship and first since Shane Lowry's 63 in 2019 (R3)
- First player since Rickie Fowler in 2018 to record a score of 65 or better in three different majors in a single year (Rahm's scores: 65/R1/Masters Tournament, 65/R4/U.S. Open, 63/R3/The Open Championship)

- Leads the PGA TOUR with four scores of 63 or better this season (62/R2/THE CJ CUP in South Carolina, 63/R4/Sentry Tournament of Champions, 61/R3/Mexico Open at Vidanta, 63/R3/The Open Championship)
- With a win, would become the first player to win five times in a season, including two majors, since Jordan Spieth in 2014-15
