Second-round lead notes

- 17 36-hole leaders/co-leaders to win the TOUR Championship (most recent: Patrick Cantlay/2021)
- 2 36-hole leaders/co-leaders to win the TOUR Championship since the FedExCup Starting Strokes era began in 2019
- 36-hole leaders/co-leaders to win individual stroke-play events on TOUR in 2022-23 (most recent: Lucas Glover/FedEx St. Jude Championship)

Viktor Hovland (T1/-16)

- Records a second-round 64 in his fourth consecutive start at the TOUR Championship
- 5th second-round lead/co-lead on TOUR (most recent: 2023 PGA Championship/T2); 1-for-4 to date in converting to victory
- Moved to No. 2 in the FedExCup after winning last week's BMW Championship, his fifth career TOUR victory; seeks to become the fourth player in history to win the BMW Championship and FedExCup in the same season, and the eighth to win consecutive FedExCup Playoffs events

Collin Morikawa (T1/-16)

- With birdies on his final two holes, opens with rounds of 61-64–125 to break the TOUR Championship 36-hole scoring record of 127, previously set by Tiger Woods in 2007
- 4th second-round lead/co-lead on TOUR (most recent: 2023 The Sentry/2nd); 1-for-3 to date in converting to victory
- Stands as the only player in the field to remain bogey-free through 36 holes
- Has not won on TOUR since the 2020-21 season: (2) WGC-Workday Championship, The Open Championship

Miscellaneous Notes

- Scottie Scheffler (3rd) enters the weekend two shots back, marking second time in the FedExCup Starting Strokes era that the No. 1 seed entering the week has not held at least a share of the 36-hole lead (Justin Thomas/2019)
- Making his seventh consecutive start at the TOUR Championship, **Xander Schauffele (T5)** posts a second-round 64 to reach 12-under, recording his 23rd of 26 career rounds under par in the event
- With a 3-under 67, three-time FedExCup champion **Rory McIlroy (7**th) records his 30th consecutive round at par or better on TOUR, the longest active current streak
- McIlroy is looking to become the first back-to-back FedExCup champion; no defending champion has finished higher than 7th in the FedExCup (Justin Thomas/2018, Patrick Cantlay/2022)
- Wyndham Clark (T8) leads all first-timers in the field through 36 holes, followed by Adam Schenk (T11), Tom Kim (18), Nick Taylor (T21) and Taylor Moore (T29)
