**Things to Know**

- **Keegan Bradley** records opening 54-hole score of 189, his lowest on the PGA TOUR and one stroke shy of the all-time PGA TOUR record; seeks sixth career TOUR victory
- 2019 Travelers Championship winner **Chez Reavie** searches for his fourth career TOUR title; posts his lowest career opening 54-hole score (190)
- Bradley and Reavie play in the final round together for the third time on TOUR (2019 Travelers Championship, 2023 Sentry Tournament of Champions)
- Australian **Adam Scott** seeks to become the first international winner at the Travelers Championship since 2016 (Russell Knox/Scotland)
- Defending champion **Xander Schauffele** (T18) has never successfully defended a title in five previous attempts on TOUR

**Third-Round Lead Notes**

- 8 Third-round leaders/co-leaders at Travelers Championship to win since 2000 (most recent: Xander Schauffele/2022)
- 18 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win individual stroke-play events on TOUR this season (most recent: Wyndham Clark/U.S. Open)

- With a 62-63-64 start, 189 marks his lowest opening 54-hole score on the PGA TOUR (previous: 196/2018 BMW Championship); one stroke shy of the all-time PGA TOUR record for opening 54-hole score (188/twice/Justin Thomas/2017 Sony Open in Hawaii; Steve Stricker/2010 John Deere Classic)
- 189 marks lowest opening 54-hole score at this event since it moved to TPC River Highlands in 1984 (previous: 192/Brendan Todd/2020)
- Holds 54-hole lead/co-lead for the fifth time on TOUR; 0-for-4 when attempting to convert into victory (T2/2012 Genesis Invitational, 2nd/ 2013 AT&T Byron Nelson, 2nd/2021 Valspar Championship, T2/2022 Wells Fargo Championship)
- Making 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive tournament start (best: T2/2019)
- PGA TOUR victories (5): 2011 AT&T Byron Nelson, 2011 PGA Championship, 2012 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, 2018 BMW Championship, 2022 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP

- Has finished runner-up four times in his next start on TOUR after missing the cut in his previous start on TOUR

**Additional Notes**

- 2019 Travelers Championship winner **Chez Reavie** (2nd/-20) posts back-to-back 63s en route to his lowest opening 54-hole score on the PGA TOUR (previous: 194/2019 Travelers Championship); seeks fourth career PGA TOUR title (2008 RBC Canadian Open, 2019 Travelers Championship, 2022 Barracuda Championship)
- 2021 FedExCup champion **Patrick Cantlay** (3rd/-16) records bogey-free 61 and sits five shots back heading into the final round; holds five top-5 finishes this season; seeks ninth career PGA TOUR victory and first since 2022 BMW Championship
- **Rickie Fowler** (T4/-15) records a 60 (-10) marking his career-low score on the PGA TOUR (previous: 62/R1/2023 U.S. Open); made eagle on Hole No. 6 for his third eagle this week, marking second TOUR event of career with three or more eagles (2009 Fortinet Championship); in search of sixth career TOUR title and first since 2019 WM Phoenix Open
- Australian **Adam Scott** (T4/-15) seeks to become the first international winner at the Travelers Championship since Scotland’s Russell Knox in 2016 and his first victory since the 2020 Genesis Invitational
- Notables at T7 and seven strokes back include **Justin Thomas** (-14) and **Scottie Scheffler** (-14); largest come-from-behind-win at this event is seven strokes (Brad Faxon/2005)
- The scoring average marks the second lowest scoring average through three rounds at TPC River Highlands:
