Additional Notes

- Restoration centered on returning the course to its original rugged, rustic look, restoring fairway contours and bunkers, new greens, and eliminating non-native vegetation.

- This will be the first U.S. Open with bermudagrass rough since 2005 at Pinehurst.

- GCSAA Director of Golf Courses and Grounds Chris Wilson was an assistant at Southern Hills for the 2001 U.S. Open and 2007 PGA Championship.

- North Course superintendent Dan Catterson's wife Lorabeth is a GCSAA assistant director of agronomy at nearby Hillcrest Country Club, which hosted a U.S. Open qualifier last week.
