## Matt Fitzpatrick Wins the 2022 Championship

Matt Fitzpatrick is a champion once again at The Country Club. The 27 -year-old Englishman who triumphed nine year ago at this iconic venue when he claimed the U.S. Amateur, became just the 13 th man and the first non-American to also add the U.S. Open Championship to his portfolio.

In winning the 122nd edition of the championship on a chilly New England Sunday by one stroke over past U.S. Junior Amateur champions Will Zalatoris and Scottie Scheffler, Fitzpatrick joined World Golf Hall of Famer and 18-time majo champion Jack Nicklaus as the only golfers to have won Nicklaus accomplished his feat at Pebble Beach Golf Links 1961 and 1972.
Now 50 years later Fitzpatrick put himself in rarified conpany.
"The feeling's out of this world," said Fitzpatrick, who carded final-round 68 for a 6 -under total of 274 . "It is so cliche, but it's stuff you dream of as a kid. I can retire a happy man tomorrow.
"Any time you're sharing a record with Jack Nicklaus, it's unbelievable. So for me to have that as well is incredible gratulate me. Coming from jost at the presentation to conworld."
Fitzpatrick put on a ball-striking clinic on Sunday, hitting 17 of 18 greens. The only miss was on the 503 -yard 10 th a hole the members play as a par 5 that was statistically the championship's toughest (4.39). Trailing Zalatoris by one, Fitzpatrick fortunes changed at the par-4 13th when he converted a 49-footer for birdie.

When Fitzpatrick won the 2013 U.S. Amateur title at this ven erable venue - one of the five founding clubs of the USGA - he closed out Oliver Goss of Australia on the 15th hole, and he essentially won the U.S. Open on the same hole, making from a spot in the right rough where spectators had matted the turf down.
"It was one of the best shots I hit all day," he said. "To do that and take advantage of the break I had was fantastic" Zalatoris, whose tee shot on No. 15 landed in thick rough failed to get up and down from a greenside bunker. That gav cool customer from Sheffield closed with three consecutive pars. On the par-4 18th, a hole he bogeyed on Saturday Fitzpatrick reached the putting surface from a left fairway bunker, a play some thought was risky.

Zalatoris had one final chance to force a two-hole aggregate
playoff, but his 15 -foot putt on the 18th green burned the left
edge of the hole. It was his second consecutive runner-up finish in a major, having lost a three-hole aggregate playo Justin Thomas at last month's PGA Championship.
"Matt's shot on 18 is going to be shown probably for the res of U.S. Open history," said Zalatoris. "I walked by it, and thought that going for [the green] was going to be [gutsy], was just incredible. So hats off to him. He played great all was just

## Championship History

On Oct. 4, 1895, the first U.s. Open Championship was conducted by the United States Golf Association on the nine-hole course of Newport (R.I.) Golf and Country Club.
The first U.s. Open was considered something of a sideshow to the first U.S. Amateur, which was played on the same course and during the same week. Both championships had been scheduled for September but were postponed due to a conflict with a more established Newport sports spectacle, the America's Cup yacht races

Ten professionals and one amateur started in the 36 -hole competition, which was four trips around the Newport cours in one day. The surprise winner was Horace Rawlins, 21, an English professional who was the assistant at the host co awins scored 91-82-173 with the gutta-percha ball.

Prize money totaled $\$ 335$, of which Rawlins won the $\$ 150$ first prize. He also received a gold medal and custody of the Open Championship Trophy for his club for one year.

In its first decade, the U.S. Open was conducted for ama teurs and the largely British wave of immigrant golf profes sionals coming to the United States.

As American players began to dominate the game, the U.S. Open evolved into an important world golf championship. An Jol J . McDermott became the first native-born
in 1913, the U.S. Open really took off when Francis Ouimet, a 20 -year-old American amateur, stunned the golf world by defeating the famous English professionals Harry Vardon and Ted Ray in a playoff

Another surge in the championship's popularity coincided with the amazing career of Georgis amateur Robert T. Jon Jr., who won the U.S. Open four times (1923, 1926, 1929, and a boom in entries caused the USGA to introduce sec tional qualifying in 1924
In 1933, John Goodman became the fifth and last amateur to win the U.S. Open. The others were Ouimet, Jerome D. Travers (1915), Charles Evans Jr. (1916) and Jones.
In each era, the world's greatest players have been identified by surviving the rigorous examination provided by the
U.S. Open. Ben Hogan's steely determination boosted him to four victories (1948, 1950, 1951, 1953). Arnold Palmer's reco ome from seven strokes off the lead, cemented his das ing image. Jack Nicklaus' historic assault on the professional ecord book began when he won the first of his four U.S. Ope Nicklaus, who also won in 1967, 1972 and 1980, is one of only Willie Anderson (1901, 1903, 1904, 1905), Jones and Hogan. In 1954, the U.S. Open course was roped from tee to green
for the first time. That year also marked the first national television coverage. Coverage was expanded by ABC Sports
in 1977 so that all 18 holes of the final two rounds were in 1977 so that all 18 holes of the final two rounds were live for the first time on ESPN. NBC began televising the U.S. open in 1995 and was followed by Fox in 2015. NBC returne s the broadcast partner in 2020 at Winged Foot Golf club. he format of the U.S. Open has changed several times. The SGA extended the championship to 72 holes in 1898, with 36 holes played on each of two days. In 1926, the format was anged to 18 holes played each of two days, then 36 holes ent format of four 18 -his aily rounds was implemented for the first time.

In 2002, a two-tee (No. 1 and No. 10) start was used for the irst and second rounds. In addition, Bethpage State Park ty owned by the public to host a U.S. Open International qualifying sites were added in 2005 and the champion at inehurst Resort \& Country Club, in Village of Pinehurst, N.C. was Michael Campbell, who qualified in England.
