Things to Know

- After entering the final round trailing Patrick Rodgers by one shot, Corey Conners edges PGA TOUR Rookie Sam Stevens by one stroke for his second Valero Texas Open title (2019, 2023)
- Conners picks up his second TOUR win in his 153rd start at the age of 31 years, 2 months, 27 days; he is the third Canadian to win on TOUR this season
- Conners becomes the 10th multiple winner of the Valero Texas Open and moves to No. 18 in the FedExCup
- Conners is the first player since K.H. Lee (2021, 2022 AT&T Byron Nelson) to record his first two TOUR victories at the same event
- One week after finishing T3 at the Corales Puntacana Championship, Stevens finishes a career-best runner-up
- Rodgers falls to 0-for-4 in converting 36- and 54-hole leads to victory
- Matt Kuchar (T3) closes with a 68, his tournament-record 17th consecutive par-or-better round in the event
- Nicolai Hojgaard (T28) and Ryan Gerard (T56) earn Special Temporary Membership on the PGA TOUR

- Picks up his second PGA TOUR victory in his 153rd start at the age of 31 years, 2 months, 27 days
- Earns 500 points to move to No. 18 in the FedExCup standings
- With wins in 2019 and 2023, becomes the 10th multiple winner of the event (first since Zach Johnson/2008, 2009)
- First player since K.H. Lee (2021, 2022 AT&T Byron Nelson) to record his first two TOUR victories at the same event
- Is the third Canadian to win on TOUR this season: Mackenzie Hughes (Sanderson Farms Championship), Adam Svensson (The RSM Classic)
- After opening with an 8-under 64, becomes the first player to carry the first-round lead/co-lead on to victory since the Valero Texas Open moved to TPC San Antonio in 2010
- Is the third first-round leader/co-leader to win this season, joining Tony Finau (Cadence Bank Houston Open) and Jon Rahm (Sentry Tournament of Champions)
- Wins for the first time in four attempts with the first-round lead/co-lead

Additional Player Notes

 Coming off a T3 at last week's Corales Puntacana Championship, PGA TOUR rookie Sam Stevens finishes a careerbest runner-up; en route to a final-round 66, had multiple eagles in a round (Nos. 8, 17) for the first time on TOUR



- 2001 and 2022 runner-up **Matt Kuchar** (T3) closes with a 4-under 68, marking his tournament-record 17th consecutive par-or-better round in the event; has seven top-15 finishes in his last 11 starts at TPC San Antonio
- Sam Ryder (T3) records his second top-five finish in his last seven starts (T4/2023 Farmers Insurance Open)
- Seeking his first PGA TOUR win in 235 starts, second- and third-round leader **Patrick Rodgers** (5th) closes with a 1-over 73 and falls to 0-for-4 in attempts to convert 36- and 54-hole lead/co-leads on to victory
- Chez Reavie (T6) birdies his final five holes for a 7-under 65 and picks up his first top-10 finish since winning the 2022 Barracuda Championship
- Andrew Novak (9th) earns his first top-10 finish in 42 PGA TOUR starts
- Rickie Fowler (T10) has his fourth top-10 finish of the season; is his sixth top-20 finish in his last seven starts
- 51-year-old **Padraig Harrington** finishes T10 in bid to become the TOUR's third-oldest winner; marks his 56th top-10 finish and first since the 2021 PGA Championship (T4)
- **Ben Martin** posts back-to-back top-10 finishes for the first time in 220 PGA TOUR starts (T8/Corales Puntacana Championship, T10/Valero Texas Open)
- In his bid to become the fifth player to successfully defend his Valero Texas Open title and first since Zach Johnson in 2009, **J.J. Spaun** finishes T22
- Both Nicolai Hojgaard (T28) and Ryan Gerard (T56) earn Special Temporary Membership on the PGA TOUR
