Things to Know

- Taylor Moore plays final 11 holes bogey-free and 4-under par to post 4-under 67 and earn first PGA TOUR title
- Moore becomes the sixth player in history and second in the last three years to make the Valspar Championship his first TOUR win (most recent: Sam Burns, 2021)
- Moore sinks 5-foot, 6-inch par putt on the 72nd hole to finish the tournament with a 100-percent conversion rate on putts inside of 7 feet (64 of 64)
- Adam Schenk bogeys 72nd hole to finish one stroke behind Moore, but posts first runner-up finish in 165th career TOUR start
- 2015 Valspar Championship winner Jordan Spieth bogeys two of final three holes (Nos. 16 and 18) to finish T3 and two strokes behind Moore in bid to become the event’s fifth multiple winner
- Sam Burns, winner of the 2021 and 2022 Valspar Championships, finishes solo-sixth and joins Luke Donald (2012-14) as the only other player with top-10s in three consecutive years at this event

- Earns first career PGA TOUR win in 46th career start and second season on TOUR with final-round 67, the lowest final round by a Valspar Championship winner since 2018 (Paul Casey/65)
- Victory comes at the age of 29 years, 7 months, 19 days
- Sixth player to earn his first TOUR victory at the Valspar Championship: Carl Pettersson (2005), Gary Woodland (2011), Kevin Streelman (2013), Adam Hadwin (2017) and Sam Burns (2021)
- Fourth first-time winner on TOUR this season, and third first-time winner in the last four TOUR events (Adam Svensson/The RSM Classic, Nico Echavarria/Puerto Rico Open, Kurt Kitayama/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)
- First winner since Max Homa at the Farmers Insurance Open who did not hold the 54-hole lead (trailed outright 54-hole leader Adam Schenk by two strokes after round three)
- Finishes the tournament with a 100-percent conversion rate on putts inside of 7 feet (64 of 64), including par saves from 4 feet, 7 inches (No. 8) and 5 feet, 6 inches (No. 18) in the final round
- Only player who finished fifth or higher on the final leaderboard who did not make a bogey on the back nine Sunday; Sam Burns (6th) was the only other player who finished T16 or higher and recorded a bogey-free back nine Sunday
- Cards one of four rounds of 67 or better Sunday: K.H. Lee/66, Sam Burns/67, Erik van Rooyen/67, Moore/67
- Season-high finish in 14 starts prior to Sunday’s victory was T11/Farmers Insurance Open; he entered the week with six top-25s, but zero top-10s this season
- As a PGA TOUR rookie last season, recorded 10 top-25s, including four top-10s, in 28 starts

- Missed cut (71-74) in Valspar Championship debut last year
- Last win in a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event was the 2021 Memorial Health Championship on the Korn Ferry Tour, which propelled him to his first TOUR card at the conclusion of the 46-event 2020-21 season

Adam Schenk (2nd/-9)

- Bogeys 72nd hole (previously made two birdies, one bogey at No. 18 this week) to finish one stroke behind Moore
- Records career-high finish in 165th PGA TOUR start (previous career-high finish: T3/2021 Shriners Children's Open)
- Makes 71-foot, 1-inch birdie putt at the par-4 12th (final birdie of round), the longest made putt of his career
- Prior the 71-foot, 1-inch birdie putt at No. 12, Schenk had made 56 feet, 10 inches of putts through the first 11 holes
- Schenk's birdie putt conversion from 23 feet, 6 inches at No. 9 was his longest made putt of the week prior to No. 12
- Entered the week with four top-25s, but zero top-10s in 16 starts on TOUR this season (best finish: T12/Shriners Children's Open)

Miscellaneous notes

- 13-time PGA TOUR winner and 2015 Valspar Championship winner **Jordan Spieth** (T3/-8) bogeys two of final three holes (par-4 16th and 18th) for 1-under 70, records season-high finish in ninth start of 2022-23 TOUR season, posts third consecutive top-25, and third top-10 in last five starts (T6/WM Phoenix Open, T4/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)
- Spieth's tee shot at the par-4 16th was one of five balls hit into the water in the final round
- Spieth's tee shot into the par-3 17th was the closest to the hole by anyone in the field in the final round (6 feet, 8 inches)
- Four-time PGA TOUR winner **Sam Burns** (6th/-5) closes with 4-under 67 in bid to win third consecutive Valspar Championship, joins Luke Donald (1st/2012, T4/2013, T4/2014) as only other player with top-10s in three consecutive years at this event
- Burns' solo-sixth also marks his fourth top-15 in five appearances at this event (1st/2022, 1st/2021, T30/2019, T12/2018)
- Six-time DP World Tour winner **Tommy Fleetwood** (T3/-8) cards 1-under 70, just his second score in the 70s in eight career rounds at the Copperhead Course, for his second top-10 on TOUR this season (T4/2022 THE CJ CUP in South Carolina); went 46 TOUR starts without a top-three finish (most recent: 3rd/2020 Honda Classic)
- Fleetwood has four finishes of T4 or higher in his last nine TOUR starts (T4/2022 Genesis Scottish Open, T4/2022 Open Championship, T4/2022 THE CJ CUP in South Carolina, T3/2023 Valspar Championship)
- **Wyndham Clark** (5th/-6) makes four birdies in final eight holes, rallying to 1-under 70 after a double bogey at No. 2 and bogey at No. 3; ties his second-best finish on TOUR in 129th career start (2nd/2020 Bermuda Championship [lost to Brian Gay in playoff]; T5/2019 3M Open)
- Clark has three top-10s this season, equaling his most top-10s in a single season on TOUR (three in 30 starts/2021-22; three in 27 starts/2018-19)
- **Cody Gribble** (T7/-4) follows a T7 at the Puerto Rico Open with a second consecutive top-10; his only other top-10s in 93 career PGA TOUR starts prior to the Puerto Rico Open came in consecutive starts in October 2016 (T8/Fortinet Championship; 1st/Sanderson Farms Championship)
- Seven-time PGA TOUR winner **Webb Simpson** (T7/-4) records first top-10 in 10th start this season, ends drought of 25 starts without a top-10 (most recent: 2021 RSM Classic/T8), posts fourth top-10 in 12th appearance at the Valspar Championship (T8/2018, T10/2012, 2nd/2011)
- **Matt Wallace** (T7/-4) posts first top-10 in 11th start this season (last was 2022 Rocket Mortgage Classic/T10) and records highest finish on TOUR since October 2021 (T4/ZOZO Championship)
- **Ryan Gerard** (T71/+10) falls 3.378 points short of earning Special Temporary Membership this week; he is currently entered in next week's Corales Puntacana Championship as a sponsor exemption
