#### Things to Know

- Wyndham Clark picks up his first PGA TOUR victory in his 134<sup>th</sup> start at the age of 29 years, 4 months, 28 days
- Clark wins with the lowest 72-hole score (265) in Wells Fargo Championship history
- Clark becomes the sixth player to record his first TOUR victory at the Wells Fargo Championship and the eighth first-time winner of the season
- Seven-time PGA TOUR winner Xander Schauffele finishes runner-up for the 11<sup>th</sup> time in 152 TOUR starts
- Adam Scott (T5) picks up his first top-10 finish since the 2022 BMW Championship (T5)
- As the top three players not already exempt, Wyndham Clark, Michael Kim and Denny McCarthy qualify for The Open Championship at Royal Liverpool

- Earns his first PGA TOUR title in his 134<sup>th</sup> start at the age of 29 years, 4 months, 28 days
- With the win, collects 500 FedExCup points and moves from No. 36 to No. 5 in the FedExCup standings
- Becomes the sixth player to make the Wells Fargo Championship their maiden TOUR title, joining Anthony Kim (2008), Rory McIlroy (2010), Rickie Fowler (2012), Derek Ernst (2013) and Max Homa (2019)
- Is the eighth first-time winner on TOUR in 2022-23
- 265 represents the lowest winning score at the event (previous: 267/Rory McIlroy/2015)
- Third champion at the event with four rounds in the 60s, joining Lucas Glover (2011) and Jason Day (2018)
- Final-round 68 is his TOUR-leading 35<sup>th</sup> round in the 60s this season
- Improves to 1-for-2 when holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (other: 2019 Honda Classic/T7); is the first 54-hole leader/co-leader to win the Wells Fargo Championship since Max Homa in 2019
- Held share of the second-round lead, becoming just the second 36-hole leader/co-leader to win the Wells Fargo Championship (Tiger Woods/2007)
- Previous-best finish on TOUR: 2020 Bermuda Championship/runner-up (lost in a playoff to Brian Gay)
- Career-best six top-10s on the season, highlighted by four top-six finishes in last six starts (3<sup>rd</sup>/Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Beau Hossler, 5<sup>th</sup>/Valspar Championship, 6<sup>th</sup>/Corales Puntacana Championship, 1<sup>st</sup>/Wells Fargo Championship)
- Wins in his third start in the Wells Fargo Championship (MC/2019, T43/2021, 1st/2023)

• As one of the top three players not already exempt, joins Michael Kim (7<sup>th</sup>) and Denny McCarthy (T8) to qualify for The Open Championship at Royal Liverpool

# Miscellaneous notes

- Seven-time TOUR winner **Xander Schauffele** finishes runner-up for the 11<sup>th</sup> time in 152 starts; joins Jon Rahm and Scottie Scheffler with a TOUR-leading eight top-10 finishes this season
- Making his ninth start of the season, Adam Scott (T5) picks up first top-10 since the 2022 BMW Championship (T5)
- Defending champion Max Homa finishes T8; no player has ever successfully defended the event
- **Jimmy Walker** finishes T14 in his 400<sup>th</sup> start on the PGA TOUR
- **Rickie Fowler** finishes T14 for his eighth top-20 finish in his last nine starts on TOUR (T31/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)
- Three-time champion **Rory McIlroy** (T47) fails to finish in the top 10 for just the third time in 12 starts at the Wells Fargo Championship (MC/2011, T16/2018, T47/2023)
