- The WM is generally considered to be the largest attended sporting event in the world outside of the Olympic Games.
- The winter was cold and rainy which led to a slow overseed establishment.
- Thanks to generous support of the Harrell's company the volunteer program is back to normal for the maintenance team. Many typical volunteers will be assisting with the Super Bowl in town.
- The course is closed for play Thursday of advance week to allow Concert in the Coliseum to complete their build for the Maroon 5 concert on Saturday of advance week.
- A five-acre area on interior of property had to be worked to accommodate a new 30,000 sq. ft. merchandise tent and food and beverage outlet.
- The course lies within a flood retention basin controlled by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation.
- The course is both Audubon and GEO certified.
- There are long-range plans for turf reductions.
- Wildlife on the course include rattle snake, quail, bobcat, raccoons, coyote, duck.
