Weather: Friday: Sunny. High of 72. Wind E 10-18 mph. Play was suspended due to darkness at 6:07 p.m., with the entire afternoon wave yet to complete their round. Saturday: Partly cloudy. High of 64. Wind E 10-20 mph. The second round resumed at 7:45 a.m. and was completed at 10:34 a.m.

Things to Know

- In first title defense, 2022 WM Phoenix Open winner Scottie Scheffler seeks to become the seventh player to successfully defend his tournament title
- Scheffler marks the first defending champion to hold the 36-hole lead/co-lead at the event since Johnny Miller in 1975
- Adam Hadwin seeks to become the second Canadian to win the event (George Knudson/1968)
- World No. 3 Jon Rahm, No. 6 Xander Schauffele and No. 17 Jordan Spieth sit two shots back at the midway point

- 6 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win the WM Phoenix Open since 2000 (most recent: Rickie Fowler/2019)
- 4 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win on TOUR in 2022-23 (most recent: Tony Finau/Cadence Bank Houston Open)

Scottie Scheffler (T1/-10)

- Earned his first career PGA TOUR victory at the 2022 WM Phoenix Open
- Holds sixth 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and is 1-for-5 converting the victory (2022 Masters Tournament)
- Marks first WM Phoenix Open defending champion to hold the 36-hole lead/co-lead since Johnny Miller in 1975 (Phoenix Country Club)
- Seeks to become the seventh player to successfully defend WM Phoenix Open title

- Two players have successfully defended a title this season (Max Homa/Fortinet Championship, Rory McIlroy/THE CJ CUP in South Carolina)
- Five players successfully defended a title during the 2021-22 season, the most since 2007 (5); two of those last season were players that successfully defended their first career PGA TOUR title (K.H. Lee/AT&T Byron Nelson, Sam Burns/Valspar Championship)
- Making fourth start at the WM Phoenix Open (MC/2020, T7/2021, Won/2022)
- Three top-10s in five starts during the 2022-23 season (T3/World Wide Technology Championship, T9/Cadence Bank Houston Open, T7/Sentry Tournament of Champions)
- Four-time PGA TOUR winner in 2022 (WM Phoenix Open, Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, Masters Tournament)
- Reigning PGA TOUR Player of the Year

Adam Hadwin (T1/-10)

- Holds third 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and is 1-for-2 converting the victory (Won/2017 Valspar Championship, T6/2021 3M Open)
- Seeks second PGA TOUR title in 225th start (2017 Valspar Championship)
- Would become the second Canadian to win the event (George Knudson/1968)
- Two Canadians have won on TOUR this season (Mackenzie Hughes/Sanderson Farms Championship, Adam Svensson/The RSM Classic)
- Making ninth start at the WM Phoenix Open (best: T12/2017)
- Has two top-10s in seven starts during the 2022-23 season (T10/Shriners Children's Open, T7/Cadence Bank Houston Open)

Jon Rahm (T3/-8)

- Making eighth WM Phoenix Open start and has not finished worse than T16 in 2017 (best: T5/2015 as an amateur)
- Opened the season with four consecutive top-10s, including wins in back-to-back starts (Sentry Tournament of Champions, The American Express)
- Holds the TOUR's longest active cuts made streak (23), having last missed the cut at the 2021 Fortinet Championship
- Last FedExCup leader to win on TOUR: Scottie Scheffler/2022 Masters Tournament

Miscellaneous Notes

- Coming off back-to-back top-three finishes in his sixth WM Phoenix Open, World No. 6 **Xander Schauffele** (T3/-8) has finished no worse than T17 (2018) in five prior starts at the event
- With an 8-under 63 in round two, **Jordan Spieth** (T3/-8) seeks his fourth top 10 in his seventh WM Phoenix Open start
- World No. 1 **Rory McIlroy** (T28) sits at 2-under 140; making second WM Phoenix Open start (T13/2021)
- **Scott Piercy** withdrew prior to the resumption of the second round
