Things to Know

- Sam Burns defeats Scottie Scheffler (21 holes) and Cameron Young tops Rory McIlroy (19 holes) to advance to the Championship Match of the 2023 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, marking the first time in event history both semifinal matches went extra holes
- This week marks the first time since 2017 that both finalists enter the Championship Match with a perfect 6-0-0 record
- Burns advances to the Finals in his debut appearance at the event, while Young does so in his second start
- With the loss, top-seeded Scheffler’s winning streak at Austin Country Club is snapped at 10 matches; he was seeking to become the first player to advance to the Championship Match in three straight appearances
- Tiger Woods remains the only player to successfully defend a title at the event (Tiger Woods/2004)

Sam Burns

- Advances to the Championship Match in his tournament debut after defeating top-seeded Scottie Scheffler on the 21st hole (with a birdie-3 on the par-4 14th hole)
- Last player to win his WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play debut: Geoff Ogilvy, 2006
- Seeks fifth career PGA TOUR victory (2021: Valspar Championship, Sanderson Farms Championship; 2022: Valspar Championship, Charles Schwab Challenge)

Scottie Scheffler

- Was seeking to become the first player to advance to the Championship Match in three straight appearances
- Tiger Woods (2004) remains the only player to successfully defend a Dell Technologies Match Play title
- Streak of victories at the event is snapped at 10; record falls to 15-3-2 at Austin Country Club

Cameron Young

- Defeats Rory McIlroy with a birdie-4 on the first extra hole (No. 12) to advance to the Championship Match for the first time in his second tournament appearance
- Six consecutive match victories after going 1-2-0 in his tournament debut in 2022
- Seeks first career PGA TOUR victory (five runner-up finishes)
- Would become the second youngest winner in tournament history at 25 years, 10 months, 19 days; youngest: Scottie Scheffler, 2022 (25 years, 9 months, 6 days)

Rory McIlroy

- Following a loss on the first extra hole to Cameron Young, the 2015 champion will face Scottie Scheffler in his second career appearance in the Consolation Match (lost to Rafa Cabrera-Bello, 3 and 2, in 2016)
- Falls to 2-2 in semifinal matches at the event
- Most matches won at the event: Tiger Woods (36), Matt Kuchar (36), Ian Poulter (33), McIlroy (33)
