**COMPLETED First-Round Notes – Friday, November 3, 2023**

**Thursday weather:** Mostly sunny. High of 85. Wind WSW 7-13 mph.

**Friday morning weather:** Partly cloudy. High of 74. Wind N 3-7 mph.

**Thursday suspension:** Play was suspended due to darkness at 5:48 p.m. with 10 players left to complete the round.

**Friday resumption/completion:** The first round resumed at 7:30 a.m. Friday and was completed at 8 a.m. The second round began as scheduled at 6:25 a.m.

**Cameron Percy (1<sup>st</sup>/-10)**

- Ties career-low round on TOUR with a 62 (632<sup>nd</sup> career stroke-play round); only other 62 came in the second round of the 2010 Shriners Children’s Open (lost in a playoff)
- At age 49, is the oldest player to shoot 62 or better on the PGA TOUR since Jim Furyk (51) at the 2022 Sony Open in Hawaii (62, R1)
- Third career 18-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 0-for-2 to date (T35/2010 Texas Children’s Houston Open, T14/2013 Puerto Rico Open)
- At age 49, is the oldest player to hold the 18-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR since Phil Mickelson (50) at the 2021 Wells Fargo Championship
- Making his 218<sup>th</sup> career start on the PGA TOUR; career-best result is a runner-up at the 2010 Shriners Children’s Open during his rookie season (Jonathan Byrd won with a hole-in-one on the fourth playoff hole)
- Four top-25s in 20 starts this season (best result: T12/The Classic in The Palm Beaches)
- Competing this season out of the 126-150 category after finishing No. 137 in the 2021-22 FedExCup Playoffs and Eligibility Points List

**Additional Player Notes**

- Four-time PGA TOUR winner **Camilo Villegas** (T2/-8), competing on a sponsor exemption, cards a 64, his lowest score on TOUR since the second round of the 2022 Sony Open in Hawaii (64)
- **Stephan Jaeger** (T12/-6) made a hole-in-one at the par-3 11<sup>th</sup> (181 yards), the second ace of his PGA TOUR career and first since the first round of the 2021 Corales Puntacana Championship
- 2022 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year **Cameron Young** (T6/-7) is making his first start since the BMW Championship and is the highest-ranked player in the field (No. 17 in the Official World Golf Ranking); a player that qualified for the BMW Championship has won three of the four tournaments during the FedExCup Fall and Young is the only player among the top 27 that did so
- 32 of the 132 players in the field (24.2%) hit all 14 fairways in the first round
