Erik van Rooyen (Winner/-27)

- Wins second PGA TOUR title in his 91st start at the age of 33 years, 8 months, 15 days (first title: 2021 Barracuda Championship)
- Becomes first player to make eagle on the 72nd hole and go on to win since Hideki Matsuyama at the 2021 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP
- Becomes the first winner to play the final three holes (in regulation) in 4-under or better since Rickie Fowler at the 2015 PLAYERS Championship (eagle, birdie, birdie, then won in playoff)
- With a final-round 63, becomes the seventh winner on TOUR this season with a final-round score of 63 or better and second consecutive (Collin Morikawa/63, ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP)
- Becomes the first player to win a PGA TOUR event at a golf course designed by TGR Design, led by 82-time TOUR winner Tiger Woods
- Is responsible for the last two wins on the PGA TOUR by a player from South Africa (2021 Barracuda Championship, 2023 World Wide Technology Championship)
- Becomes third player from outside the United States to win the World Wide Technology Championship, joining Graeme McDowell (2015) and Viktor Hovland (2020, 2021)
- Earns fourth top-10 of the season and first since the Barracuda Championship (T6)
- Collects 500 points and moves from No. 125 to No. 63 in the FedExCup standings
- Can moves as high as No. 81 in the Official World Golf Ranking (entered week No. 193)
- Has recorded 13 consecutive rounds of par or better, tied for the third-longest active streak on TOUR (longest: 23, Beau Hossler)

Camilo Villegas (T2/-25)

- 263 ties his low 72-hole score on TOUR (2014 Wyndham Championship/won)
- Finished runner-up for the fifth time in his 387th career start on TOUR
- Was seeking to become the first player to win while competing on a sponsor exemption since Martin Laird at the 2020 Shriners Children's Open
- Moves to No. 147 in the FedExCup standings
- Earns his first top-10 finish since the 2021 Classic in The Palm Beaches

Matt Kuchar (T2/-25)

- 2018 World Wide Technology Championship earns 15th runner-up finish on TOUR in his 535th career start
- Was seeking to become the 117th player to reach 10 wins on the PGA TOUR
- With a win, would have become the sixth player to make a quadruple bogey (or worse) and go on to win and first since Tom Kim at the 2022 Wyndham Championship

- The top 125 in the FedExCup Fall standings thru The RSM Classic will be exempt into all Full-Field events and THE PLAYERS Championship next season
- Nos. 51-60 in the standings at the conclusion of The RSM Classic will qualify for two Signature Events in 2024 via The Next 10 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, The Genesis Invitational)
- Player(s) currently projected to move into the top 125: none
- Player(s) currently projected to move out of the top 125: none
- Player(s) currently projected to move into The Next 10: Matt Kuchar (No. 66 to No. 52), Sam Ryder (No. 63 to No. 59)
- Player(s) currently projected to move out of The Next 10: **Thomas Detry** (No. 60 to No. 62), **Luke List** (No. 59 to No. 61)
