#### **TOP STORYLINES**

World No. 11 **Viktor Hovland** has won the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba each of the last two years and is in search of his third consecutive victory at the event. The last player to win a single PGA TOUR event three years in a row is Steve Stricker at the John Deere Classic (2009, 2010, 2011).

Through six events during the 2022-23 season, two defending champions have won: Max Homa (Fortinet Championship) and Rory McIlroy (THE CJ CUP in South Carolina). Last season, there were five such winners, the most in a season since 2007 (5).

All three of Hovland's PGA TOUR wins have come outside the United States, with one at the 2020 Puerto Rico Open and two (2020, 2021) at Mayakoba. Hovland has made two starts this season, highlighted by a T5 at the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP.

Reigning PGA TOUR Player of the Year **Scottie Scheffler** is making his first start since losing his position as World No. 1, a position he held for 30 consecutive weeks until Rory McIlroy won THE CJ CUP in South Carolina. Scheffler would return to No. 1 in the Official World Golf Ranking with a win or solo-second this week.

64 players players in the field competed at last week's Butterfield Bermuda Championship, including nine that finished in the ton 10

Seamus Power won last week's Butterfield Bermuda Championship, earning his second PGA TOUR title and first since the 2021 Barbasol Championship. The last player to win back-to-back weeks on the TOUR schedule is Tony Finau (3M Open, Rocket Mortgage Classic in 2022). The last player to win back-to-back starts on TOUR is Rory McIlroy, who won THE CJ CUP in South Carolina in October in his first start since winning the TOUR Championship.

PGA TOUR rookie **Thomas Detry**, who finished runner-up in Bermuda, enters the week No. 7 in the FedExCup standings, the highest position of any player without a win this season. Detry became the second player from Belgium on record (1983-present) to finish runner-up in a PGA TOUR event, joining Thomas Pieters (2017 Genesis Invitational).

The last three times a player has made a hole-in-one on the first hole of a tournament have have occurred at the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba, all on the par-3 10th:

Two of the par 3s at El Camaleón Golf Course ranked among the five easiest on TOUR last season (out of 204 total).

## **ADDITIONAL STORYLINES**

Two-time major champion **Collin Morikawa** is making his third start of the season and tournament debut at the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba. Morikawa is in search of his first victory since the 2021 Open Championship (26th start since).

There are four players from Mexico in the field (all competing on sponsor exemptions):

Argentina's **Emiliano Grillo** has three top-10s in seven consecutive starts at the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba (T10/2016, T9/2017, T8/2020). Grillo has made five starts this season, highlighted by a pair of top-10s at the Sanderson Farms Championship (T5) and ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP (4th), and enters the week No. 16 in the FedExCup standings.

PGA TOUR rookie **Austin Eckroat** finished T12 at the 2020 World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba competing on a sponsor exemption as a senior at Oklahoma State.

Four of the six winners on TOUR this season entered the week as one of the five highest-ranked players in the field:

Four of the last six FedExCup Champions have won a tournament in the fall portion of the season before going on to win the season-long race. Most recently, Rory McIlroy won THE CJ CUP last fall and went on to win the 2022 FedExCup. The other players to do so in the last six seasons are Justin Thomas (2016 CIMB Classic, 2017 FedExCup), Justin Rose (2017 WGC-HSBC Champions, 2018 FedExCup) and Patrick Cantlay (2020 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, 2021 FedExCup).
