Things to Know

- The only player bogey-free through 36 holes, **Russell Henley** sets the tournament's opening 36-hole score of 16-under 126 after matching 8-under 63s
- Since the start of the 2020-21 season, of the seven opening 36-hole scores of 126 or better on TOUR, Henley has recorded three of them
- Following birdies on seven of his first nine holes, **Sam Ryder** signs for a 6-under 65; seeks first career PGA TOUR title in his 143rd start
- Will Gordon, who led after round one with a 9-under 62, heads into the weekend at 13-under 129 in bid for first TOUR title
- Brian Harman follows an ace at the par-3 fourth hole with three straight birdies on Nos. 5-7 en route to a 5-under 66
- World No. 9 Collin Morikawa follows an even-par 71 in round one with a bogey-free 8-under 63, one stroke shy of his
 career-low on the PGA TOUR
- In his bid for a third consecutive title at the event, two-time defending champion **Viktor Hovland** (T14) heads into the weekend at 8-under 134; last to win the same TOUR event three consecutive years is Steve Stricker (John Deere Classic/2009-11)

- Making his fifth consecutive start at the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba, opened with matching bogey-free 8-under 63s; only player in the field bogey-free through 36 holes
- Sets the tournament's opening 36-hole score of 16-under 126; previously 14-under 128, set by Matt Kuchar in 2018

Since the start of the 2020-21 season, there have been seven opening 36-hole scores of 126 or better on TOUR.
 Henley has recorded three of them

- Is 1-for-7 when attempting to convert a 36-hole lead/co-lead into victory on TOUR (2013 Sony Open in Hawaii)
- Hit 12-of-14 fairways in both rounds and leads the Scrambling category at a perfect 9-for-9
- Best finish in four previous starts in the event was T29 in his first start of 2018
- Comes off a 2021-22 TOUR season highlighted by four top-10 finishes in 22 starts; best: P2/Sony Open in Hawaii
- A three-time winner on TOUR, seeks his first victory since the 2017 Cadence Bank Houston Open

Additional Notes

- After matching his career low round on PGA TOUR with a 62 in round one, 18-hole leader Will Gordon (T2/-13) followed with a 4-under 67 in round two; making third start at the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba (T55/2019, MC/2020); seeks first TOUR title in his 48th TOUR start; best finish: T3/2020 Travelers Championship
- Following his opening-round 7-under 64, **Sam Ryder** (T2/-13) birded seven of his first nine holes (Nos. 1,2, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9) en route to a 6-under 65; making his sixth start at the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba (best result: 54th/2018)
- 2017 World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba champion **Patton Kizzire** (4th/-12) opened with matching 6-under 65s in bid for a third PGA TOUR title and first since the 2018 Sony Open in Hawaii
- Brian Harman (T6/-10) aced the par-3 fourth hole from 113 yards (pitching wedge), which he followed with three consecutive birdies on Nos. 5-7 en route to a 5-under 66; since the start of the 1990 season, four players (five instances) have now made a hole-in-one and then birdied each of the next three holes:
 - o Brian Harman, 2022 World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba (R2)
 - Robert Allenby, 2005 Buick Open (R4)
 - o Mark Calcavecchia, 1992 BMW Championship (R3)
 - Mark Calcavecchia, 1992 WM Phoenix Open (R2)
 - o Fulton Allem, 1990 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard (R3)
- Playing this week on a sponsor exemption, **Harry Higgs** (T6/-10) tied his career-low score on the PGA TOUR with a bogey-free 9-under 62 (R2/2020 Fortinet Championship); round included seven birdies and an eagle-2 at the par-4 third hole from 86 yards (lob wedge); the score falls one shy of the 18-hole score record held by Matthew Wolff (R1/2021) and Roland Thatcher (R3/2008)
- En route to a 4-under 67, **Greyson Sigg** (T9/-9) made no pars on his first 10 holes and just three total (Nos. 11, 14, 18); eight birdies, six bogeys and an eagle at the par-5 seventh; last player to make only three pars in a round on TOUR before this week was Patrick Cantlay (R4/2022 Travelers Championship/76)
- World No. 9 **Collin Morikawa** (T14/-8) followed an even-par 71 in round one with a bogey-free 8-under 63, one stroke shy of his career-low on the PGA TOUR; this week marks his first start in the event
- Other Notables: Viktor Hovland (T14/-8), Seamus Power (T22/-7), Scottie Scheffler (T29/-6)
- The four players from Mexico competing on sponsor exemptions, **Sebastián Vázquez**, **Isidro Benitez**, **Armando Favela** and **José de Jesús Rodríguez** all missed the cut
