Things to Know

- Three-time PGA TOUR winner Russell Henley leads the World Wide Technology Championship by six strokes over Will Gordon and 2017 champion Patton Kizzire entering the final round
- Henley records the 18th opening 54-hole total of 191 or better in PGA TOUR history (previous 17 all went on to win)
- Henley's lead is the largest 54-hole lead on TOUR since Jon Rahm at the 2021 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (not counting TOUR Championship/FedExCup Starting Strokes)
- Two holes-in-one during the third round: Seamus Power (No. 8) and Greyson Sigg (No. 10)
- With a win, Power (4th) would become the first player to win back-to-back weeks on TOUR since Tony Finau (2022 3M Open, Rocket Mortgage Classic)

- 8 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win the World Wide Technology Championship (most recent: Viktor Hovland/2021)
- Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win on TOUR in 2022-23 (most recent: Seamus Power, Butterfield Bermuda Championship)

- Largest 54-hole lead on the PGA TOUR outside of the TOUR Championship (FedExCup Starting Strokes) since Jon Rahm at the 2021 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (6; forced to WD after the third round due to a positive COVID-19 test); Scottie Scheffler led by six strokes after the third round of the 2022 TOUR Championship and finished T2
- 1-for-6 to date with the 54-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR

- Has not made a bogey (or worse) through 54 holes; one player has played a tournament this season without making a bogey or worse: Tom Kim, Shriners Children's Open (Won)
- Making his fifth consecutive start at the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba; best result in four prior starts: T29/2018
- Three-time PGA TOUR winner (2013 Sony Open in Hawaii, 2014 Honda Classic, 2017 Cadence Bank Houston Open)

Seamus Power (4th/-15)

- Winner of last week's Butterfield Bermuda Championship
- Made two eagles, including a hole-in-one at the par-3 8th (other: par-4 11th)
- Second career hole-in-one on TOUR (first since 2019 PLAYERS Championship)
- Second career round on TOUR with multiple eagles; first: 2022 Sentry Tournament of Champions (2/R2)
- Last to win back-to-back weeks on the PGA TOUR schedule: Tony Finau (2022 3M Open, Rocket Mortgage Classic)
- Last to win in back-to-back starts: Rory McIlroy (2022 TOUR Championship, THE CJ CUP in South Carolina)

Miscellaneous notes

- First-round leader **Will Gordon** (T2/-16) records a 3-under 68; Gordon's best result on TOUR came at the 2020 Travelers Championship (T3 as a sponsor exemption)
- 2017 champion **Patton Kizzire** (-16) enters the final round T2, six strokes back of Henley; two-time defending champion Viktor Hovland is the only player with multiple titles in tournament history
- There were two holes-in-one made during the third round: Seamus Power (No. 8) and Greyson Sigg (No. 10) and there have been three made through three rounds; first PGA TOUR event with three or more aces since the 2021 Travelers Championship (3)
