**Things to Know**

- Russell Henley wins the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba by four strokes, earning his fourth PGA TOUR title and first since the 2017 Cadence Bank Houston Open
- Henley and Brian Harman (University of Georgia) are the first pair from the same college to win and finish runner-up at the same PGA TOUR event since Patrick Reed and Henrik Norlander (Augusta University) at the 2021 Farmers Insurance Open
- Reigning PGA TOUR Player of the Year Scottie Scheffler cards a final-round 62 to finish T3, his second consecutive top-five at the event
- Seamus Power (T3) moves to No. 1 in the FedExCup for the first time in his career
- Two-time defending champion Viktor Hovland finishes T10

- Earns fourth PGA TOUR title in his 249<sup>th</sup> career start at the age of 33 years, 6 months, 25 days
- PGA TOUR wins (4): 2013 Sony Open in Hawaii, 2014 Honda Classic, 2017 Cadence Bank Houston Open, 2022 World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba
- Ties Viktor Hovland (2021) for lowest 72-hole total (261) in tournament history
- Wins in fifth start at the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba (best result in four prior starts: T29/2018)
- Ties six others or second-most wins among players from the University of Georgia

- Led by three strokes after the second round with a 36-hole total of 126

- Improves to 2-for-8 with the 36-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR
- Seventh 36-hole leader/co-leader to win the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba
- Third 36-hole leader/co-leader to win on TOUR this season
- Has recorded three of the seven opening 36-hole totals of 126 or lower on TOUR since the start of the 2020-21 season
- Set opening 36-hole tournament scoring record (previous: 128, Matt Kuchar/2018)
- Led by five strokes after the third round with a 54-hole total of 191
  - Improves to 2-for-7 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR
  - Ninth 54-hole leader/co-leader to win the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba and third consecutive
  - Fourth 54-hole leader/co-leader to win on TOUR this season and third consecutive
  - 18<sup>th</sup> opening 54-hole score of 191 or better in PGA TOUR history (first since Dustin Johnson at the 2020 FedEx St. Jude Championship at TPC Boston)
  - Set opening 54-hole tournament scoring record (previous: 193, Matt Kuchar/2018)
  - Largest 54-hole lead on the PGA TOUR outside of the TOUR Championship (FedExCup Starting Strokes) since Jon Rahm at the 2021 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (6; forced to WD after the third round due to a positive COVID-19 test); Scottie Scheffler led by six strokes after the third round of the 2022 TOUR Championship and finished T2

#### Miscellaneous notes

- **Brian Harman** (-19) finishes solo-second, his second career runner-up and first since the 2017 U.S. Open (T2); Henley and Harman (University of Georgia) are the first pair from the same college to win and finish runner-up at the same PGA TOUR event since Patrick Reed and Henrik Norlander (Augusta University) at the 2021 Farmers Insurance Open
- Harman now has 25 top-10s on the PGA TOUR since the start of the 2017-18 season, most of any player without a win in that span (second-most: 21, Tommy Fleetwood and Adam Hadwin)
- Reigning PGA TOUR Player of the Year **Scottie Scheffler** (-18) cards a 9-under 62 to finish T3; would have returned to No. 1 in the Official World Golf Ranking with a win or solo-second
- Scheffler's 62 was his sixth score of 62 or better since he joined the TOUR at the start of the 2018-19 season, the most of any player in that span
- **Seamus Power** (T3/-18), winner of last week's Butterfield Bermuda Championship, moves to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings for the first time in his career
- Two-time defending champion **Viktor Hovland** (-16) finishes T10; last player to win the same PGA TOUR event three years in a row: Steve Stricker, John Deere Classic (2009-11)
